PRE-TOURNAMENT INFORMATION:

Upon qualifying for the State Soccer Semi-Finals, Coaches are encouraged to review and complete the necessary information found on the SDHSAA website under “Qualifying Information” and “Program Information.”

FRIDAY PRACTICE SCHEDULE:

A practice schedule has been developed, allowing each qualifying team a one-hour slot for practice on the game field. Other than the host school, teams are restricted from using this facility for practice outside of the SDHSAA-assigned time slot. Locker rooms will be available during practices on Friday. However, teams will not be allowed to leave items in the locker room before, during or after their practice time as they will be shared with another team. A total of 18 soccer balls will be provided by the SDHSAA for Friday practice session(s).

TEAM ENTRANCE:

On both Friday & Saturday, please drop off team members & park buses in the bus drop off loop BEHIND the Fieldhouse (*at the NORTHEAST CORNER of the complex*) near the intersection of 15th Street & Pine Street. Cones will be set up at the entrance and the exit of the bus loop to keep regular vehicle traffic from using that space. Someone will be there to help your bus pull in behind the Fieldhouse. **The bus will then park directly behind the Fieldhouse on the bus drop off loop. Players will be directed into a specific locker room from there.**

COACHES' MEETING:

There will not be a coaches' meeting for this years' event. Coaches of qualifying teams will be provided contact information from Randy Soma of the SDHSAA to arrange for a short meeting to distribute information.

SEEDING & DRAW:

Teams will be seeded based upon their seed points as of the completion of games on Saturday, October 5, 2024. Teams will be placed in an eight - (Class A) or twelve-team (Class AA) bracket for first round, quarterfinal, semifinal and championship game play.

HOME TEAM DETERMINATION:

The team with the better seed/higher seed points shall be the home team. Home teams shall wear DARK jerseys and sit on the bench on the west side of midfield, closest to the scoreboard. Visiting teams shall wear WHITE jerseys and sit on the bench on the east side of midfield, furthest from the scoreboard.

LOCKER ROOMS & DRESSING FACILITIES:

Locker Rooms will be provided to teams on Friday & Saturday. Teams will not be allowed to leave items in the locker room before, during or after their practice time or contest as they will be shared with another team each session. Officials will have a locker room in the Crane Youngworth Fieldhouse also.

ROSTERS:

Team Rosters will be taken from the information as submitted on the SDHSAA website as of October 5, 2024. While not all individuals who are listed on that roster must dress for tournament play, only those listed on the SDHSAA website are immediately eligible to participate in the State Tournament. Should a substitution need to be made, it must be approved by the SDHSAA prior to play. Only players listed on the official Roster Card submitted pre-game to officials will be announced by the Public Address system on Saturday.

PRE-GAME WARMUP:

Teams will be allowed a minimum of twenty (20) minutes on the game field immediately prior to each contest. Teams are asked to warm up in their half of the field, located in front of their bench/team area. Additional warm up space is available on the west end of the complex for the “Home Team” and the Southeast corner of the complex for the “Visiting Team.”

PLAYING FIELD & GAME BALL:

Yankton’s Crane Youngworth Field has a synthetic turf surface and teams are expected to prepare to play in any elements. The SDHSAA State Finals will utilize a Baden Perfection Thermo ball for all contests.

ATHLETIC TRAINERS:

An Athletic Trainer from Sanford as well as Yankton High School’s Athletic Trainer Trevor Woods who is provided by Avera Sacred Heart Hospital and Avera Sports will be on hand for the duration of the tournament for your teams’ needs. Please communicate with Host Site management in advance, should there be any special circumstances or concerns that you might have.

VIDEO TAPING POLICY:

All Video Taping is allowed by teams competing in the State Finals. Camera individuals may not block the view of spectators while video-taping. Please contact Yankton HS Activities Director Ryan Mors on the Friday during your practice time or by email ryan.mors@k12.sd.us if you are wanting a space to film from a booth room inside the press box (if available) at Crane Youngworth Field.

Furthermore, SDHSAA By-Laws concerning Video Taping at State Events have been passed to read as follows:

- Participating schools may videotape the game or event that involves their team or athletes.
- Upon advising the SDHSAA and the team(s) or individuals involved in a specific state event, schools may videotape other team(s) or individuals for scouting purposes at said state event.
- Parents or Guardians may videotape the game or event that involves their child

BROADCAST:

South Dakota Public Broadcasting will be broadcasting the State Soccer Tournament live from the site on Saturday, including web-cast and over-the-air broadcast for each of the championship contests. Please honor any requests for appearances or information that you may receive from SDPB personnel, including halftime, pre- and post-game interviews.

AWARDS PRESENTATION:

Following each contest on Saturday, awards will be presented to participating head coaches to distribute to their teams. SDPB will take an official team photo of the team and make available to parents/fans/schools as requested.

No specific on-field access will be provided to the general public for pictures or gatherings. Teams and fans will meet in the same area where additional warm up time was made available...On the west end of the complex for the "Home Team" and the Southeast corner of the complex for the "Visiting Team" for pictures.

TOURNAMENT TICKETS & PASSES:

Each qualifying team will receive the following passes:

- A maximum of 25 player/manager student passes, per the listing of a team's roster on the SDHSAA website
- A maximum of four coach passes, per the listing on the roster page on the SDHSAA website
- Four additional complimentary tickets per school will be provided

Information regarding High School Student Press Passes and/or Adult Field Passes may be found in the SDHSAA Handbook, including the appropriate forms necessary for completion.
