3. Financial report as of December, 2023

4. Fall Region Workshop Reports (reports given by Region Representatives)

- a. Big Sioux (Jaycee Tebay) Workshop went well, plans to send out an email to improve community help, worked on leadership, kids were able to choose their workshops. Located in Brookings SD, 15-18 schools attended. They had students take quizzes to split them into groups.
- b. Capital (Kiera Briggs) Held in Pierre, 6 schools, 96 kids, games, and workshops. A speaker attended.
- c. James River (Ava Brannen) Held in Mitchell, 2 groups sponsored water and donuts, 11 schools, 154 kids. There were several workshops that students rotated through. Ava gave a speech at the end talking about increasing community service activities.
- d. Northern Lakes (Gemma Street) Watertown, 13 out of 30 schools attended. There were different workshops and activities. They had a speaker. There was a theme and dress-up theme at the meeting.
- e. Rushmore (Taylor Hansen) Located at a Dakota Technical College Center. Over 100 kids and about a dozen schools. Several workshops, and three speakers attended.
- f. Spirit Point (Jackson Klawonn) 280 students attended. More students attended than originally thought. Held at Augustana. Workshops were held in 7 rotations. A speaker attended and spoke for about 15 minutes to the whole group. Jackson spoke about how to run for the state board.
- g. Upper Missouri Located in Mobridge, 10 schools and almost 200 students attended. Students were split into groups and went through workshops.

5. Social Media Update (State Reporter)

a. Lucy Walker informed the board that she is looking for more photos and ideas from fellow board members and schools. She has been working on posting region workshops, get to know you, and holiday posts.

6. Convention Theme

a. The board decided that they will not have a convention theme, but they will have a dance theme. The dance theme will be "neon".

• Group Project

The board decided they would have two fundraisers. They would encourage student councils to bring hats, gloves, and scarves to the convention to donate to shelters around the state. The convention would also put out letter making materials on lunch tables and at the dance so people could write and decorate letters to veterans. (The board would put paper, and coloring utensils on the tables with examples of letters that could be written. Once the student council members write the letters there will be a basket that they could put them in.) The board also discussed having the Native American flag song performed at the convention after the pledge of allegiance.

• Activities: Baggo Tournament, dance, board games, study, National Guard Laser Tag and/or inflatables, NEW ACTIVITIES???

The activities will be, bean bag tournament, dance, boardgame room, national guard archery tag, photo booth, and movie room. David introduced the idea of setting up a karaoke room. Brooks discussed the idea of having a foosball table in return for a donation to the activities association by a donor.

• Review presenters hired for convention

The current holder of the trophy will bring it back, Brooks will take the trophy and present it to the school winner at the banquet. There are two trophies, the Cashi Cup (the school that donates the most) and the Cappi Cup (the school that donates the most per capita).
