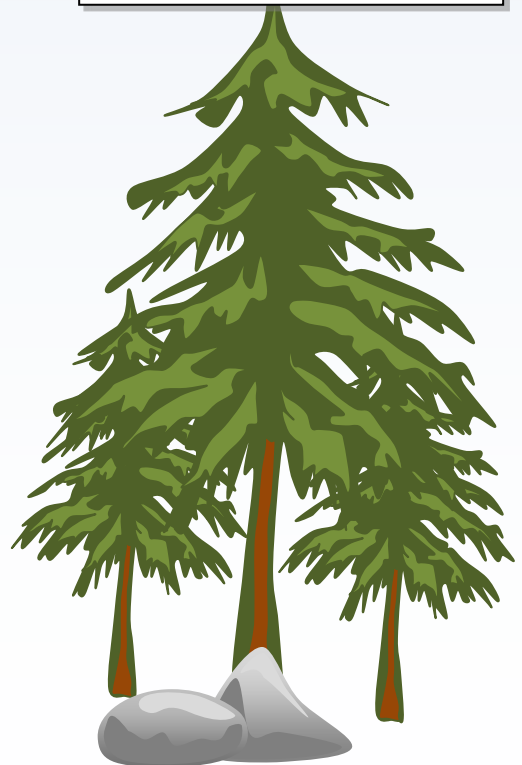

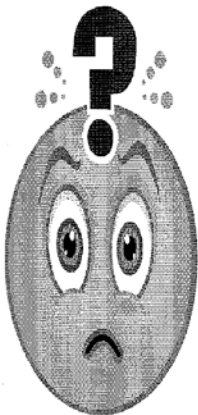

TABLE ETIQUETTE IDENTITY

Divide into groups of six. Give each student an "identity."

1. When asked a question, you will only respond with Yes or No. Otherwise you will not speak.
2. Just stare into space. You will not speak to the group unless they ask you a question. When asked a question, shrug your shoulders and responded, "I DUNNO."



3. You must ask each person in your group/table at least one question. Find out the names of the people at your table.
4. You will talk about the weather, sports, gossip, or any crazy thing. BUT you must laugh or fidget when you talk. Stand up periodically and walk around the group. (When people are nervous, they often laugh).

5. You MUST keep the conversation going with this group at ALL TIMES. There can never be silence. It is your responsibility to engage the members of your table in conversation. Call them by their name.
6. You will be on your phone all the time. Send and receive text messages. Make your phone ring. When somebody starts to talk to you, stop them in mid-sentence to send or receive a text or answer the phone.

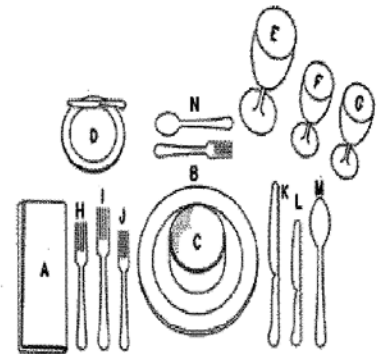


TABLE SETTINGS

What goes where on the table

and which glasses go with what drinks

Real easy, the etiquette experts tell us. The general rule with utensils is to start from the outside of your place setting, and work your way toward the service plate (main meal plate); soup spoon first, then fish knife and fork, then service knife and fork.
