SDSCA ANNUAL STATE CONVENTION

The South Dakota Student Council Association's 29th Annual State Convention was held at the Premier Center in Sioux Falls, April 3rd – 5th. A record 968 students and advisors attended from 73 high schools across the state.

Focusing on the theme "U.S.A. (Unlimited Student Achievement)", the SDSCA Convention utilized a combination of breakout sessions and large group instructional presentations. Guest speaker for the convention was Mayor Mike Huether of Sioux Falls. The keynote speaker was Amy Gallimore, Creative Director and CEO of Four16 Training Solutions and a Leadership Fellow at TRI Leadership.

The convention also featured a state-wide community service project, which made 72 fleece blankets to disperse among communities throughout the state. The goal of the project is for the blankets to be given to women/children shelters, hospitals, and nursing homes to aid those who need some help.

Convention activities included the annual business meeting of the SDSCA and the election of the Association's 2016-2017 state officers, as well as the election of the officers for each of the Association's seven regions.

"SOUTH DAKOTA WARREN E. SHULL STUDENT COUNCIL ADVISOR OF THE YEAR"

The "Warren E. Shull Student Council Advisor of The Year Award" is named after Warren E. Shull, who founded the National Association of Student Councils (NASC) while he was a high school student council president. NASC is the nation's only national organization providing leadership development training for high school and middle level students and activity advisors.
