2006 HIGH SCHOOL PRESS CONVENTION

South Dakota State University, Brookings

September 25, 2006

The 2006 High School Press Convention was held on the SDSU campus in Brookings on September 25th. Over 350 high school journalists and their advisors from 31 schools attended the convention.

During the morning sessions the students attended programs lead by Bobby Hawthorne and Doug Dreyer. For 20 years Hawthorne directed the Texas Interscholastic League Press Conference and is a popular speaker at journalism workshops conventions and seminars. Dreyer, who teaches at Northern State University in Aberdeen, has worked as a freelance photojournalist for the past 11 years. His work for the Associated Press has been published in nearly every major newspaper in the world.

The Convention concluded with the "General Awards Session in the afternoon". This session included the announcement of the results for the "On-the-Spot" contests that were held that morning, and the Annual Publications Contest for Newspapers, Yearbooks and Literary Publications. The members of the SDHSAA Journalism Advisory Committee made the awards presentations.

FOUNDER'S AWARD

Each year, during the Annual High School Press Convention, the Founders award is presented to an individual in recognition of outstanding service to high school journalism education through the teaching of the principles of good journalism in South Dakota. The recipient of the award is selected by the Journalism Advisory Committee of the South Dakota High School Activities Association.

2006 Founders Award – Ann Lundquist Gettysburg High School

The 2006 Founder's Award was presented to Ann Lundquist, during the annual High School Press Convention on September 25, 2006.

Ann Lundquist began her teaching career at Salem High School in the fall of 1967. She taught English and German and advised the school newspaper. She moved on to Lake Preston High School where she taught English for four years and advised the school newspaper.

She began teaching at Gettysburg High School in 1978. For 28 years she has taught English I, English II, Speech, German I and German II, and Journalism, and served as the advisor for the school newspaper.

Ann was the first recipient of the Gettysburg Golden Apple award. The Golden Apple Award recognizes a member of the staff for outstanding teaching and service to the school district.

Jeff Marlett, Gettysburg superintendent, said that Ann is one of those teachers whose students always come back to see and to thank her for the impact she has made in their lives. "She is truly a gift to the teaching profession."
