SDSCA ANNUAL STATE CONVENTION

The South Dakota Student Council Association's 30^{th} Annual State Convention was held at the Rushmore Plaza Civic Center in Rapid City, April 9th – 11th. A total of 916 students and advisors attended from 66 high schools across the state.

Focusing on the theme "Lead Us West", the SDSCA Convention utilized a combination of breakout sessions and large group instructional presentations. Guest speaker for the convention was Mayor Steve Allender of Rapid City. The keynote speaker was internationally renowned speaker and entertainer, Billy Riggs.

The convention also featured a state-wide community service project, which made 62 fleece blankets to disperse among communities throughout the state. The goal of the project is for the blankets to be given to women/children shelters, hospitals, and nursing homes to aid those who need some help.

Convention activities included the annual business meeting of the SDSCA and the election of the Association's 2017-2018 state officers, as well as the election of the officers for each of the Association's seven regions.
