FOREWORD

So that each member school of the South Dakota High Athletic Association may have a complete and convenient history of the Association, a Year Book is printed annually and all important events of the Association for the previous school year are listed in the order in which they occurred.

Some member schools may have the complete file of these Year Books. If so, they have a history of the Association from its birth in 1905. The first Year Book was printed in 1927 and contained a summary of Association events from 1907 to 1927. In 1934 the events from 1927-1934 were given. In 1940 the events from 1934 to 1939 were listed. In 1942 there was a summary of the events from 1939 to 1942. The book published July, 1946, contained items of interest including summaries from 1942 to 1946. July 1 each year from 1946 to the present time, a Year Book was printed annually.

None of the early copies of the Year Book are available, however, there are a few copies of the recent editions which can be obtained by request from the SDHSAA.

HISTORY

1951-1952

1951-1952 was probably the "banner" year of all times as far as the SDHSAA was concerned. There was tremendous interest in athletics and a great over-all improvement in all sports. The Tennis and Golf Tournaments attracted normal participation. The number taking part in Cross Country running increased. Football was improved with eleven-man and six-man football teams outnumbering the teams of 1950-51 considerably. Basketball in both the "A" and "B" classes was above normal. The classification of teams into "A" and "B" classes had been changed and the plan used in 1951-52 seemed to be very successful, if attendance at District, Region, Section and State Tournaments could be considered as criterion.

Track continued to grow and improve. Relay Meets, Conference, Invitational Meets, all attracted larger numbers than ever before. New records were made consistently. In the State Meet, more boys participated than ever before. 246 different individuals from 35 "A" schools took part in the State "A" Meet and 267 from 85 "B" schools actually took part in the "B" Meet, totaling 513 individuals from 120 different schools. Three new State records were set, two of which were made by "B" athletes and one by an "A" athlete.

Since 1951-52 was the odd year when there was no general meeting of the South Dakota Education Association, therefore by rule, there was no general meeting of the SDHSAA and consequently there were no amendments presented to the Association Rules and Regulations.

For membership on the Hoard of Control, the term of Supt. C. H. Holgate expired and nominating petitions for Mr. Holgate of Aberdeen, and Supt. R. L. Snyder of Conde were properly presented. In the subsequent balloting, by mail, Mr. Holgate was re-elected to a regular five (5) year term expiring July 1, 1957.

Another vacancy occurred when Supt. R. E. Hald of Faulkton moved to Clark, leaving a vacancy for a short unexpired term, the member, by rule, had to be from a town whose population was under 1000, this term to expire July 1, 1953. For the position, nominating petitions were received for five men. They were Supt. G. D. Hendrickson of Philip, Supt. P. C. Washabaugh of Wolsey, Supt. A. L. Stoddard of Selby, Supt. E. M. Walz of Westport, and Supt. E. O. Tandberg of Garretson. Results of the mail bailot showed that no one had a majority of the votes cast, with Supt. Hendrickson and Supt. Washabaugh, the high men. In a run-off election, Supt. Hendrickson was elected to the short term.

An event which was effective on and after November 1 greatly benefitted all member schools. That was the act by Congress which eliminated the admission tax on high school events, including Association events. This meant savings of thousands of dollars to the member schools and to the Association. District, Region, Section and State basketball tournaments of 1951 sent \$20,348.56 to the Federal Treasury. Receipts from the same 1952 tournaments were approximately the same as in 1951. Therefore, the amount sent in for 1951 was returned to the member schools or to the Association.

The events of 1951-1952 are briefly described in the order in which they occurred and summaries may be found on other pages of this Year Book.

Tennis and Golf

The 20th Annual Golf and Tennis Tournaments were held in Sioux Falls on August 9 and 10, 1951. The number of contestants in these fine events was somewhat smaller than in 1950, however, the quality of the competitors was excellent.

Dick Olson of Watertown was the singles Champion in Tennis, defeating Charles Bailin of Sioux Falls in the finals.

In the Doubles Tournament, Watertown defeated a team from Washington High School in Sioux Falls. Dick Gison and Arlo Coplan teamed up to defeat Charles Bailin and Jay Pryor 6-2: 6-3.

The 20th Annual Golf Tournament, played on the Minnehaha Country Club Course in Sioux Falls produced some sensational golf. Cy Richards of Aberdeen won individual honors with John Enright of Sioux Falls getting the Runners-up honors. In team competition, Richards, paired with Bob Dell, took top honors for Aberdeen. Watertown was second in team play with Dale Griffen and Jerry Crump bettering a Sioux Falls team of Enright and Sam Pfiefer by one stroke, 331 to 332. The Aberdeen team toured the 36 hole course with a combined total score of 322.

1951 Coaching School

Over 200 Coaches attended the annual Coaching School in Huron, August 14, 15, 16, 17, 1951. Those in attendance felt that the School was outstanding and that Wes Fesler and his Line Coach, Lyal Clark of the University of Minnesota, did excellent jobs in teaching football.

Harry Combs of Illinois gave the Coaches assembled plenty of common sense basketball. He proved very popular as an instructor.

Jim Emmerick of South Dakota State College, did a fine job instructing in Track and Field sports as well as some instruction on the care of injuries.

In addition to the head-liners, Round Table discussions on equipment, Public Relations, and Six-Man Football were headed by Mylo Jackson, of Aberdeen, Bill Tredway, Craig Stoltz, J. F. Slocum, of Huron and R. M. Walseth of Pierre.

Huron College and Huron High Schools handled all local arrangments for the school and did a beautiful job.

Cross Country Run

In 1950 there were 51 runners from 12 schools while in 1951 there were 82 runners from 21 schools, showing a very nice growth for the Annual Cross Country Run. Annually the Run has been held at Brookings on Hobo Day and State College has generously admitted the runners and their coaches to the Hobo Day Football Classic.

In 1951, George Blackman of Cheyenne was the winner, running the course in 12 minutes and 42 seconds, which is several seconds faster than McBride's record of 13:01.5, made in 1947. To make this feat more remarkable, Blackman was unfamiliar with the course and ran a great many yards farther than any other competitor. Wayne Ragatz of Frankfort was second and Leo Hammerich of Ipswich was third.

The Flandreau Indian School won the team event placing their first three runners in 4th, 7th, and 11th places for 22 points. Sioux Falls was second and Vermillion third for team places.

Board of Control Election

Since there was no regular Biennial Meeting of the SDHSAA, there were no amendments to the Rules and Regulations of the SDHSAA presented for consideration.

As described in the History for 1951-52, Supt. Holgate of Aberdeen was re-elected to membership on the Board of Control for a regular five (5) year term and Supt. Hendrickson of Philip was elected to a short unexpired term.

Basketball Tournaments

Interest, if attendance is any criterion, in Basketball Tournaments was greater than ever before. Unofficial figures show greater attendance at District, Region, Section, and State Tournaments than in any previous year.

With the number of "A" schools increased for the tournaments in 1952, there had been some doubt as to interest in "B" competition. These doubts were quickly dispelled. The State "B" Tournament attracted the largest crowds to ever attend any State Tournament, in South Dakota, and attendance at the "A" Tournament, even with bad weather, was limited only by the capacity of the Tournament building. A good Ipswich team won the "B" Tournament, and competition was even throughout, breaks one way or another could have seen another champion. Ipswich's ability to play sound defensive ball and their uncanny way of coming through when the going "got tough" proved them to be truly champions.

In the "A" Tournament, again the ability to come through when the "chips were down" gave the championship to Brookings, a smart, smooth, poised basketball team. Competition was rugged all the way through the "A" Tournament.

Track

Three records were broken at the 1952 State Track Meet. The 1952 Meet was the largest Meet ever held and the management of the Meet was remarkable. Huron High School not only managed the Meet magnificently but ran away with top honors in the "A" Meet. Brookings and Aberdeen trailed Huron in that order.

In the "B" Meet a 4 man team from DeSmet won the Meet, closely pressed all the way by Burke, Igloo, Rosebud, and Agar.

Three new records were written into the books in the Shot Put, Discus Throw, and Mile Run. It was truly a fine Meet.


