#### FOREWORD

A Year Book, such as this issue, is printed annually and serves as an annual report of the Executive Secretary and provides each member school of the Asociation with a complete and a fairly convenient history of the Asociation. In this issue of the Year Book, all important events of the Asociation for the school year 1953-1954 are listed in the order in which they took place.

All member schools should have complete files of these Year Books, and by consulting these books they could have a very complete history of the Association, since its birth in 1905. This does not mean that a Year Book has been printed annually. The first book was printed in 1927 and it had a summary of events extending back to the first track and field meet in 1906. The second volume was published in 1934 and in this volume, the years between the first and second volumes were included. Again, a volume was published in 1940 and in 1942, and again in 1946. Since 1946 a Year Book has been published annuallly.

The SDHSAA office contains several volumes of each of these reports, but none, except for the more recent issues, are available to our member schools.

The 1953 issue was the first to contain pictures of all winners in all events. This present book also contains pictures, and from year to year we hope to continue this practice. We sincerely hope that you like this Year Book and hope that this copy will be kept in your school files for a permanent record.

#### HISTORY 1953-1954

Participation in interscholastic athletics in 1953-1954 was as great as, or greater than, any year in the Association's history. Healthy interest was shown by administrators, coaches, players and fans in all sports sponsored by the SDHSAA. The events in the order in which they occurred are briefly mentioned here. The tennis and golf tournaments increased in size, particularly in the golf part of these tournaments. The number of boys who actually participated in the Cross Country Run was slightly less; however, the number of schools participating was larger. Elevenman and six-man football teams were about constant in number. A few more "B" team and junior varsity games in eleven-man football were played than any year in the past, and six-man teams now number 100 or more. Since all member schools do participate in basketball there could be no increase in the number of varsity teams; however more junior varsity, "B" and second team games were played by teams representing member schools and there seems to be a slight increase in the number of girls' teams participating in interschool competition. Interest by the public is certainly not on the decline in South Dakota. Reports on district, regional, sectional and state tournaments indicate no decrease in South Dakota.

Even considering the very bad cold spring, track in South Dakota flourished. The number of meets was greater than ever before and the total numbers participating in invitational track meets and the big relay carnivals increased; and more schools actively participated in region and state meets and even considering the bad weather, many records at all meets were broken. The 1954 state track meet this year, held at Huron, was slightly larger than the 1953 meet. Five-hundred-thirty-four boys

actively took part in the "A" or "B" meets, and these athletes came from 140 or more member high schools. New state records were set in the following events, the shot put and the 440 yard dash.

Since the fall of 1953 was the "off" year, no regular meeting of the SDHSAA was held; therefore, no amendments were submitted, so the rules for the association for hte following year, 1954-1955, will be the same as those in 1953-1954, and since there was no meeting, nominations for members on the Board of Control had to be by nominating petition. Nominating petitions were filed for Coach A. A. Quintal of Mitchell to succeed himself as a member of the Board of Control, and since no other petitions were filed, Mr. Quintal was declared reelected without balloting.

Following are brief descriptions of the events of 1953-1954 in the order in which they occurred, with complete summaries and pictures to be found on the other pages of this Year Book.

#### TENNIS AND GOLF August 4-5, 1953

The twenty-second Annual Golf and Tennis Tournaments were held in Brookings on August 4-5, 1953. Lefty Johnson and H. B. MacDougal of Brookings handled the tennis tournament while Principal L. B. Horrigan and Dr. Colby of Brookings handled the golf tournament.

Fourteen tennis players participated in the singles tournament and there were seven teams in the doubles tournament. This number was a slight decrease in numbers and teams from the 1952 event. Charles Bailin of Washington High School, Sioux Falls, was the singles champion, defeating Frank Lautenschlager of Watertown, Terry Jordre of Corona and his teammate Mike Rost, and Bob Greeves of Huron to win the championship. In the doubles tournament, Charles Bailin and Mike Rost of Washington High School, Sioux Falls, teamed up to win the tennis tournament defeating Brookings in the finals; the Brookings team was made up of Gene Luke and Herbert MacDougal.

Thirty-seven high school golfers teed off in the twenty-second Annual High School Golf tournament. Eighteen holes were played on the 4th, and eighteen holes on the 5th of August. The golf was played on the Brookings Country Club Course located at Lake Campbell, South Dakota. John Enright of Sioux Falls, was the winner of the individual tournament and Pat McMahon of Brookings was the runner-up.

In team competition in the golf tournament, the Brookings team of Pat McMahon and John Steen edged out the Sioux Falls team of Enright and Gerald Smith by one stroke, 326 to 327. The number of boys participating in the golf tournament in 1953 was due to the fact that the number eligible to participate was raised from two to four.

#### 1953 COACHING SCHOOL

August 17, 18, 19, 20, 1953

The 1953 annual Coaching School in Huron was apparently a decided success. As in the last three years more than 200 coaches took advantage of this school and the reports coming in to the SDHSAA office were very good. The coaches were apparently enthusiastic about Bert Ingwersen, Line Coach of the University of Illinois and Jack Gardner, the Basketball Coach from the University of Utah. Ingwersen, with his

enthusiasm and love for the game of football and his thorough knowledge of the fundamentals of the game, gave valuable information to all football coaches. In the past, name coaches have been used in the Coaching School, but none received more praise than did Mr. Ingwersen.

Jack Gardner, formerly of Kansas State and now of the University of Utah, presented his material on basketball and basketball coaching in a very clear, concise manner, and Jack did not spare himself—he worked overtime to give the coaches as much as possible in the two-day period. Again, we believe that Jack Gardner was as successful as any coach ever to appear on the SDHSAA Coaching School.

Jim Emmerich of the South Dakota State College, while not as well known nationally as the two men previously mentioned, did every bit as well in his part of the Coaching School. Jim handled three sessions on coaching track, and one session was devoted to the care of injuries. Jim's efforts were greatly appreciated by all coaches in attendance.

In addition to the name coaches in football, basketball and track, Mylo Jackson of Aberdeen, the Coach of 1953 State "A" championship basketball team and Bob Koenig, who coached the 1953 "B" champions at Onida, each handled part of one session telling the assembled coaches what they did to prepare their teams, particularly for the State Tournament. These men did very well.

Howard Grim of Tripp handled two sessions of six-man football at the Coaching School and gave the six-man coaches at the school lots of good sensible material on this particular sport.

#### 1953 CROSS COUNTRY RUN

October 17, 1953

With weather conditions almost perfect for cross country running, 43 runners from 15 schools participated in the annual cross country run held at Brookings on Hobo Day. The quality of the runners, plus the ideal weather, made the winner, Dwight Sunrhode of the Flandreau Indians, bettered the old record by 17 seconds. The winner was closely followed by a teammate of his, Mark Running Wolf and by Darrell Foss of Madison. The event was managed by Jim Emmerich, Track Coach at State College, who has handled this job since cross-country running was added to the sports of the SDHSAA. In team competition in the cross country run, Flandreau Indian School was also the winner. They had runners finish 1st, 2nd and 9th, which gave them a total of 12 points. Madison, with runners placing 3rd, 10th, and 28th, was second, with a team total of 41 points. Sioux Falls was in third place with runners finishing 14th, 15th and 16th for 45 points.

#### BASKETBALL TOURNAMENTS

If there was a downward trend, nationally, in basketball interest, it certainly did not show itself in South Dakota. If figures on attendance at Section, Region and State Tournaments can be used as a guide to basketball interest in the state. Figures on attendance at these tournaments show definite trends upward. The 1954 tournaments were played, the third year in the new "A" and "B" set up, and from a look at the teams in each tournament, it is quite apparent that there is no need for a third class in Sounth Dakota High School basketball.

This year the State "B" Tournament was played in Aberdeen and each session in the championship series filled the Aberdeen Arena to or beyon dits capacity. The "A" Tournament, played, this year, in Huron's spacious new arena, set new record attendance for the "A" Tournament.

More complete reports on the Tournament will be found in other pages of this Year Book so here, other than to mention the names of the winners, little will be found about the tournaments. As you will recall, Hayti defeated Provo for the championship in the "B" Tournament and Deadwood defeated Parkston in the finals to win the "A" championship.

Moving pictures of part of the games in both Tournaments were taken. All first round games in the championship series, plus the championship game in each tournament were filmed and these films are available to member schools through the film library of South Dakota State College at Brookings. We have pictures of the following games in the "B" Tournament. Highmore-Delmont; Provo-Murdo; Selby-Claremont; Hayti-Lennox, as well as the championship game between Provo and Hayti.

In the "A" Tournament, films were taken of Custer-Webster game; Madison-Parkston game; Huron-Aberdeen game; and the Sioux Falls- Deadwood game in the first round and the Deadwood-Parkston game, the championship game.

#### TRACK

#### May 14-15, 1954

Two records fell in the State meet and another was tied and the largest number of competitors ever to participate took part in the 1954 meet at Huron during May. Coach Paul Marschalk and his staff at Huron High School did a masterful job in handling this meet. No time during the meet was there a hitch and the weather was beautiful. Washington High School of Sioux Falls won the "A" meet and Tyndall High School won the "B" meet. The records broken were the shot put and the 440 yard run around two curves, and the record tied was the 220 yard dash around one curve. Complete summaries of these two meets will be found on other pages of this Year Book as well as pictures of all individual and team winners.

#### HISTORY OF BASKETBALL TOURNAMENTS

The SDHSAA was organized in 1905 and at that time until 1912, had competition on a statewide basis in track and debate. In 1912 Huron College sponsored a state high school basketball tournament, which was open to all high school teams. This tournament continued until 1917 when, at the request of Huron College, it was taken over by the Board of Control of the SDHSAA and has been managed by the Board since that time. The number of teams in the state tournament varied until 1924 when eight teams participated. Since 1924 the state tournament has been an eight team affair with the exceptions of 1939, 1940 and 1941 when four team "A" tournaments were tried.

From the mid 1920's there was agitation for two classes and in 1930 an "A" and "B" plan was tried. The 1930 plan was as follows: The state was divided into thirty-two districts. The thirty-two winners went to eight "A" regions and from there the eight winners qualified for the State "A" Tournament. The thirty-two runners-up in the district tournaments went to eight "B" regions and the eight winners thereof qualified for the State "B" Tournament. This plan was not popular and was used but once. Agitation continued, however, and in the fall of 1935 an "A" and "B" plan was developed whereby the schools with enrollments of 300 or over were the "A" schools and all others were the "B" schools.

Under this plan the top teams in the Eastern South Dakota Conference qualified for the "A" Tournament and the lower teams in the Conference competed with the other "A" schools to eliminate down to the number needed to put eight teams in the State "A" Tournament. "B" teams were given the right to challenge "A" teams for the right to enter the "A" Tournament. From this plan the present plan has developed.

The first "A" and "B" Tournaments were held in 1936.

Starting with the 1951-52 season, another change was made in the "A" and "B" setup. Basically the plan is as follows: The 32 largest member schools, by enrollment, are the "A" schools; thus the number of "A" schools was increased from 16 to 32. All other schools are "B" schools, and the "B" set-up was basically the same as in the past several years except for considerable redistricting.

For the "A" schools the state was divided into eight (8) four-team sections, single elimination tournaments were played in each section with the eight (8) section winners qualifying for the State "A" Tournament. The plan is to run two years. For 1952, 1953 and 1954 the new plan was

very successful.

#### TOURNAMENT RESULTS, 1954

When the firing was completed and the smoke cleared away, two new Chamions were crowned following the 1954 "B" and "A" Tournaments. Favored Hayti won the "B" Tournament and "little" Deadwood was the "A" Champion.

The 1954 Tournaments were highly satisfactory to the schools and people of the state. They saw favored teams fall by the wayside and strangers come up strong. Attendance at the Tournaments was more than satisfactory and the crowds were friendly, orderly, and a real pleasure to deal with. Never in Tournament history was there so little dissatisfaction exhibited, and so frequently good play was loudly applauded. The fans of the state are "swell".

In the "B" Tournament Hayti emerged the Champion. They were the favored team although other teams in the Tournament gave them nothing and were not awed by their presence. The Hayti team was a sound, well-coached team; they were not big but had nice balance, good pasing, speed and ability to work the ball in for good shots and when the need presented itself, they "hit" well from outside.

Coach Jim Markings has done well with a swell group of boys. The

Association and the fans of the state are proud of Hayti.

The "A" Tournament furnished a new champion, Deadwood. Back in 1939 and in 1940, Deadwood set new records by winning the "B" championship two years in succession. Three years ago they were, by revision of the basketball plan, changed from a "B" school to an "A" school. Apparently the "Bears" were not awed by other teams in the "A" Tournament as they systematically took the other teams apart and came out the Champion. They deserved their Championship. They were deadly in earnest and played sound, rather deliberate basketball. Coach Glen Burgess did a swell job and had his team ready when it really counted. Congratulations, Deadwood!
