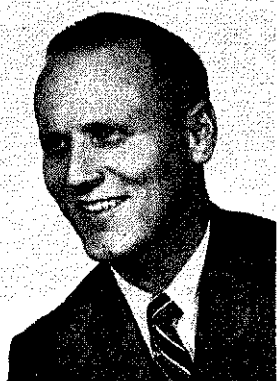

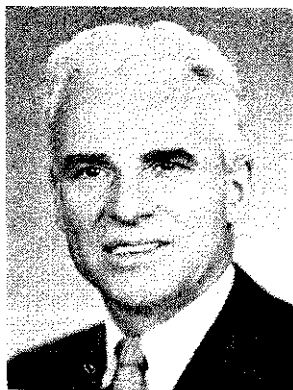

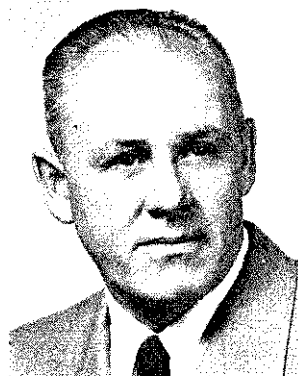

FOREWORD

The Year Book, published annually after the close of the school year, serves as an annual report of the Executive Secretary and does provide a complete review of events in the school year of 1961-1962. All statewide events in which championships are determined are summarized and listed in the order they occurred.

By saving year books, member schools could have a complete summary of the Association since it was formed in December 1905. This does not mean that a Year Book has been published each year since 1905. The first Year Book was published in 1927 and contained a summary of events from the beginning through the school year of 1926-27. The second such publication was in 1934, the third in 1940, again in 1942 and in 1946. Since 1946 the Year Book has been an annual publication.

Pictures of teams and individuals who have participated in or who have won state-wide events are shown. There have been a few missed, because of photographic failures, and this year is no exception, we have missed a few individuals. Their names, of course, will appear in the summaries.

We sincerely hope each school has been and will continue to file their copies of the Year Book as a rather complete history of the Association will be on file in each member school.

Starting July 1, 1937, R. M. Walseth was appointed Executive Secretary of the Association with office space in the Department of Public Instruction, in the Statehouse in Pierre. Because of expansion in the Department of Public Instruction and lack of space the office was moved to the St. Charles Hotel in January of 1946, where it remained until November 1, 1957, when it was moved to permanent quarters in the SDEA Building at 415 E. Capitol Avenue in Pierre. The new building is pictured on Page 3 of this Year Book.

Review of SDHSIAA Events — 1961-1962

Following you will find a short review of the events of the SDHSIAA for the year of 1961-1962. All state-wide athletic events will be found in the following pages, in the order in which the events took place.

While the Association is now an Activities Association, the events mentioned and summarized on the following pages are athletic. It is our hope that the next Year Book will be a complete one with summaries, stories and pictures of winners in all other Association events.

1961-1962 was a good year. We had many good teams, and local management of athletic events continues to improve. Our school people are concerned and much has been done to improve treatment of visiting teams and sportsmanship has shown constant improvement. We firmly believe that our athletic program, starting at the local level and running through state-wide events, compares favorably with any program in the nation.

Our interscholastic program seems to get better. More boys are playing Football, Cross Country entries have grown and the new sport of Wrestling shows signs of rapid growth and improvement. Golf and Tennis also showed gains during the year.

Basketball, of course, continues to be our major sport since each member school participated on an interschool basis. While the number of teams cannot be greater than the number of member schools, the number of boys and girls participating has increased in intra-mural competition and more "B" teams and activity teams playing interschool competition. The growth is healthy.

Wrestling has shown a gain. 1962 saw the fifth State Wrestling Tournament, the third of which was sponsored by the Association. In fact the Association assumed some financial responsibility in the 1962 tournament for the first time.

Track continues to grow and improve. It is amazing what our competitors in track accomplish. Weather, always a deterrent in South Dakota, was worse this year than ever before. Actually our track season this year was about five weeks long. This means preparation and meets and still our times, heights and distances in the many meets in the state this year were consistently good. This speaks well for the quality of our contestants and the great improvement in coaching. While the number of contestants in the "A" and "B" State Meet has to remain about the same from year to year, the number of schools sending contestants to the Region Meets was greater than ever before. We are a "hardy" lot!

The Annual Summer Coaching School was a good one and very well attended and the fourth Annual Track Clinic was one of the best, but attendance was down, for but one reason and that was weather. Roads were almost impassable.

Football and Basketball Rules Meetings for coaches and officials were continued with excellent attendance at all meetings. Howard Connors of Vermillion again handled half of the Football Rules Meetings.

The regular Annual Meeting of the SDHSIAA was held in Pierre. Several amendments were considered, two of which passed. These amendments will be considered elsewhere in the Year Book. There were several contests for Board of Control positions. Mr. Tschetter of Arlington, Mr. Turnwall of Lemmon and Mr. Price of Beresford were candidates for a two year term, Mr. Tschetter finally winning on a run-off

election, Mr. White of Watertown and Mr. Pier of Mobridge were both nominated for a regular five year term with Mr. Pier winning the election.

The demand for "A" and "B" Basketball Tournament tickets continued to be great. The "A" about as for the previous year but the demand for "B" tickets was greater than ever before. With the "B" Tournament held in the new Sioux Falls Arena, capacity about 9100, money for over 4000 adult ticket orders was returned. Naturally many were disappointed. Parts of the "B" Tournament were televised so that fans unable to get tickets were not completely shut out.

For the 2nd time in 3 years, it was necessary to run off the State "A" and "B" Track Meet in one day. Weather and track conditions forced the cancellation of all Friday events, both preliminaries and finals and with preliminaries in running events rescheduled for Saturday morning instead of Friday night. All final field events, scheduled for Friday were also held Saturday morning. Instead of running preliminaries in the Relays, the events were run in two sections, against time, on Saturday afternoon. With these adverse conditions, the track was remarkably good on Saturday and times, distances and heights were good, although no new all-time State Meet records were made.

The Tennis and Golf Tournaments, also held at the time of the State Meet, were hurt. Golf was cut from 36 to 18 holes and the entire Tennis Tournament was run off in one day.

EVENTS OF 1961 - 1962

1961 Coaching School

Huron, August 14, 15, 16, 1961

Well over 200 coaches attended the 1961 SDHSIAA Annual Coaching School and those attending were really rewarded. Dan Devine of the University of Missouri was an able lecturer on Football. He did a terrific job.

Fred "Tex" Winter of Kansas State was the featured instructor on Basketball and was tops. Mr. Winter has long been recognized as an outstanding basketball coach and coaching school instructor and he more than lived up to his recommendations.

Warren Ariail, head Trainer at Iowa State, now at Indiana University, had two sessions on training, particularly on the care of and the prevention of injuries. Mr. Ariail was wonderful.

Wally Johnson, head Wrestling Coach at the University of Minnesota, had two sessions on Wrestling and while the crowd attending these sessions was small Mr. Johnson certainly gave those in attendance much valuable information on this fine sport.

Also making short appearances on the program, were Merlin Gramm of Bridgewater, coach of the "B" Championship Basketball team and Lyle "Bud" Belk of Aberdeen, the coach of the "A" Basketball Champions. Both were real good in a trying situation. One of the rewards on penalties for winning a basketball championship is the coaches appearance at the Coaching School.

All sessions were held in air-conditioned comfort in the new "Inn" in Huron. We are deeply indebted to the management of this fine hotel for the use of these facilities.

Board of Control Meeting

August 15, 1961

During the Coaching School the Board of Control met briefly to review plans for the school year of 1961-1962. Actions taken by the Board will be found in other pages of this book.

August Administrators Meeting

Plans for the 1961-1962 school year and the initial operation of the new SDHSIAA were presented to the School Administrators at their Annual August Meeting. The Executive Secretary and various Board of Control members explained plans of operation for 1961-1962.

1961 Football Rules Meeting

Each year since 1938, with the exception of three World War II years, the Association has sponsored a series of Football Rules Meetings, based upon rules and officiating for coaches, officials, players and fans. In 1961, Meetings were held in Aberdeen, Brookings, Custer, Eagle Butte, Huron, Lake Andes, Lemmon, Mitchell, Mobridge, Philip, Pierre, Sioux Falls, Sturgis, Vermillion, Watertown and Winner. An actual count of attendance cards shows that 1022 attended these meetings. Many more attended who did not sign cards.

In South Dakota, the football season starts early and ends early. Therefore in setting up our Football Rules Meetings we try to have the meetings completed before the first week of games. To do so it is necessary to have two men divide the meetings, your Executive Secretary and Howard Connors of Vermillion. We are, indeed, fortunate to have Mr. Connors available, since he is an active official and has taught University courses on Rules and Officiating. We believe officials and coaches need these meetings before their opening games.

1961 Cross Country Run

On a rather cool and windy day, 164 runners from 37 schools started the Sixteenth Annual Cross Country Run. As in previous years the same course was used, the Golf Course at South Dakota State College in Brookings. The number of contestants was four less than in 1960, however, three more schools were represented.

Norman White Shirt of the S.D. School for the Deaf was the individual winner in the good time of 11:36.5. He was pushed most of the way by Ivan McKenzie of the Flandreau Indian School and by Dave Lewis of Rapid City who finished second and third respectively.

The Flandreau Indian High School team took team honors with 12 points. Rapid City was second with 32 points and Washington High School of Sioux Falls was third with 63 points.

The Flandreau Indian team was made up of Ivan McKenzie, Marvin Two Crow and Paul Moss.

Track Coach Glenn Robinson at SDSC ably managed this fine event.

1961 Basketball Rules Meetings

Starting October 16 and ending November 20, 1961, your Executive Secretary conducted 20 Basketball Rules Meetings in the following towns: Aberdeen, Chamberlain, Eagle Butte, Gettysburg, Hot Springs, Huron, Kadoka, Lake Andes, Lemmon, Madison, Mitchell, Mobridge, Pierre, Sioux Falls, Sisseton, Sturgis, Watertown, White River, Winner and Yankton. 1269 attendance cards were filled out at the meetings.

At each meeting, rule changes were discussed and explained. Old rules were reviewed and methods and mechanics of officiating were discussed. We believe, officials and coaches are getting a better understanding of the rules and there is apparently more uniformity in officiating.

Board of Control Meeting

November 17, 1961

The Board of Control had a meeting the evening prior to the regular Annual Meeting of the Association. Routine matters were taken care of and plans for the Annual Meeting were formulated. A complete summary of Board of Control actions will be found on other pages of this Year Book.

Regular Annual Meeting SDHSIAA

Pierre, November 18, 1961

Sixty-four member schools sent delegates to the Regular Annual Meeting of the SDHSIAA and heard several annual reports, heard discussions for and against the various amendments and several were nominated for positions on the Board of Control.

Four amendments to the By-Laws of the SDHSIAA had previously been properly submitted. They were (1) To make all accredited high schools eligible for membership in the Association; (2) To have a member of the Associated School Boards as an advisory member on the Board of Control; (3) To make only registered football and basketball officials eligible to officiate in varsity boy's football and basketball games; and (4) To allow schools not participating in basketball tournaments to add two games to their varsity basketball schedule.

In subsequent mail balloting, the first two of the above mentioned amendments were defeated and the last two received the necessary 2/3 majority vote and became effective July 1, 1962.

Since there were to be several vacancies on the Board of Control, nominations for the various vacancies were made as follows:

(1) For a regular 5 year term, starting July 1, 1962 and ending June 30, 1967, Principal R. W. White of Watertown and Supt. L. N. Pier of Mobridge were nominated. Mr. Pier won in the mail balloting following the meeting. Mr. Pier will succeed Mr. C. H. Holgate of Aberdeen, whose term expired and who was not eligible for reelection.

(2) For a term of approximately four years, starting as soon as the election was over and ending June 30, 1965, Supt. S. C. Witter of Lead was the only nominee and was declared elected. Mr. Witter was named to succeed Supt. M. E. Lindsey (deceased) of Custer.

(3) For a 2 year term beginning July 1, 1962 and ending June 30, 1964, Supt. Roger W. Price of Beresford, Supt. L. W. Turnwall of Lemmon and Supt. Amos Tschetter of Arlington were nominated and in the mail balloting following the meeting, Supt. Turnwall and Supt. Tschetter were the two high men, neither of whom had a majority vote, so a run-off election was held and Mr. Tschetter was the winner.

Mr. Tschetter will succeed Mr. Bert E. Dent, Athletic Director at Mobridge, who, by the provisions of the By-Laws of the new Activities Association, was not eligible to membership on the Board of Control.

National Alliance Football Rules Meeting

The regular annual meeting of the National Alliance Football Rules Committee was held in St. Louis, Missouri, early in January, 1962. Rules changes were made, all of which had the safety of the player as the first consideration.

Copies of the changes have been sent to all coaches and officials and will be thoroughly discussed during the Football Rules Meetings in August and September.

Your Executive Secretary is a member of the Rules Committee.

1962 State Wrestling Tournament

The third Annual SDHSIAA Wrestling Tournament was held in Huron on February 23 & 24, 1962. This is actually the fifth annual tournament, however, the first two were not sponsored by the Association.

The tournament was a good one with Spearfish the team championship winner.

A complete summary, with pictures of the twelve winners, will be found on other pages of this Year Book.

Board of Control Meeting

March 14, 1962

A regular meeting of the Board of Control was held in Huron on March 14, 1962, just prior to the State "A" Tournament.

Routine matters were handled and the sites for the 1963 Tournaments were selected. For 1963 both the "A" and "B" Tournaments will be held in Sioux Falls. The "B" Tournament to be on March 7, 8, 9, 1963 and the "A" the following week March 14, 15, 16, 1963. Terms for each tournament to be the same, that is 10% of the receipts will be paid to Washington High School and a 5% Arena tax will be collected and paid to the City of Sioux Falls.

Again a summary of Board of Control action will be found on other pages of this Year Book.

1962 State Basketball Tournaments

On other pages of this book, will be found complete summaries of the two tournaments with pictures of the sixteen teams, therefore only a brief mention of these tournaments will be made here. Suffice to say

that the Oglala Community High School team of Pine Ridge won the "B" tournament and Brookings won the "A" tournament.

Both tournaments were excellent tournaments. Attendance was up because of increased seating capacity. Officiating was good and the local management of the tournaments by school officials at Huron and Sioux Falls was even better than it previous tournaments.

1962 Track Clinic

On Saturday, March 24, the fourth Annual Track Clinic was held in Mitchell with attendance down to around 65, because of weather and road conditions. It was very bad.

We were exceedingly fortunate to have been able to secure Coach Larry Snyder of Ohio State University. He was outstanding. Mr. Snyder, an exceptional track man in his under-graduate days, has coached at his Alma-Mater for years. Because of his ability to teach, he was the head Track Coach for the U. S. Olympic Team in 1960. It is too bad weather conditions prevented more from attending.

The site, dates and talent for the 1963 Clinic have not, as yet, been determined.

1962 State Track Meet

Weather, particularly rain and lots of it caused the Board of Control to postpone all Friday events of the State Track Meet to Saturday. Preliminaries in the High Hurdles, the 100 Yard Dash, the Low Hurdles and the 220 Yard Dash were run off on Saturday morning as were the five final Field Events scheduled for Friday night. Preliminaries for the 440 Yard Run, the 880, Medley and Mile Relays, events in which preliminaries were scheduled for Friday, were eliminated and two sections in each of these events were set up and were run against time as final events on Saturday. Field events scheduled for Saturday afternoon were run off as originally scheduled.

Watertown, host for the State Meet, did a terrific job getting the track and field ready for the Saturday events. Long hours, much pumping and numerous man hours of hard labor provided a good track for Saturday's events. Too much credit cannot be given Clar Lilevjen, Dud Melichar and their crews in getting the track ready for use.

The Flandreau Indian High School was the winner of the "A" Meet, with Canton the runner-up. Onida repeated as "B" Champion with Centerville pushing all the way for the runner-up spot.

A complete summary of the "A" and "B" Meet along with pictures of all winners will also be found on other pages of this book.

1962 Golf Tournament

Rain, lightning and thunder, flooded fairways and very soft greens cut the Annual Golf Tournament from a 36 hole, two day affair to 18 holes and a 1 day event. Even so, 83 boys from 29 schools did compete in this tournament with Al Cooke of Sioux Falls the winner with a score of 73. He was pushed by Glenn Hermanson of Rapid City with 74. Mike Goldhammer of Chamberlain and Dave Hanten of Huron tied for 3rd with 76's.

In team scoring, Washington High School of Sioux Falls was the champion with Cooke shooting 73 and Terry Comstock shooting 77 making their team total of 150. Rapid City's team of Hermson and Roger DeRudder and Huron's duo of Dave Hanten and Ted Milford tying for second place with 156. Dave Wolsky of Watertown and the Municipal Club Pro did well to get half of the tournament played.

1962 Tennis Tournament

With a larger entry list than for several years in the tennis tournament, weather made it very difficult to run-off the tournament. However, by an early start Saturday, May 19 and a rather late finish, both the singles and doubles tournaments were completed in the one day. Jeff Clark of Sioux Falls defeated a fellow Washington High School student in the finals 7-5 and 8-6. Clark then teamed with Tom Weber to win the Doubles Tournament defeating Fishback and Harrison of Brookings in the finals.

Too much credit cannot be given tournament manager Ken Wight for getting the tournament completed.

Board of Control Meeting

June 1 & 2, 1962

The final Board of Control Meeting of 1961-1962 was held in Sioux Falls on June 1 and 2. Much time was spent on plans for 1962-1963 and a budget for the coming year was adopted.

The meeting was the last for C. H. Holgate, Bert E. Dent and D. W. Evans. Newly elected members, who take over July 1, 1962, Amos Tschetter of Arlington and L. N. Pier of Mobridge, attended the meeting.

Actions of the Board will be shown in the summary of Board Actions.

National Federation Meeting

The annual convention of the National Federation of State High School Athletic Associations was held at Saskatoon, Saskatchewan, Canada on July 1-4 inclusive.

Chairman of the Board R. W. Monfore, Assistant Executive Secretary D. W. Evans and Executive Secretary R. M. Walseth attended the convention. Forty-five states as well as most provinces in Canada had delegates to this convention.

Board of Control Actions

1961 - 1962

During the school year of 1961-1962, the Board of Control had five meetings. The first in Huron, August 15, at the time of the Coaching School; the second, at Pierre, November 17, the day before the Annual Meeting of the Association; the third in Pierre, January 29; the fourth in Huron on March 14, the day before the opening of the "A" Tournament; and the last meeting at Sioux Falls, June 1 and 2.

Officers of the Board of Control for 1961-1962 were elected by the Board of Control as follows: Supt. D. W. Evans, Kadoka, Chairman; Supt. R. W. Monfore, Springfield, Vice Chairman.

Increased miscellaneous allowance to teams in the "A" and "B" tournaments from \$100.00 to \$200.00.

Decided to ask the committees of the Music Association, Press Association, Speech Association and the Student Councils to continue to operate these Associations for another year, the school year of 1961-1962.

Reviewed several eligibility cases and made rulings.

Discussed ticket distribution for the 1962 Tournaments and decided to take the limit off the number of student tickets "B" school could order for the "B" tournament. Decided to raise the number of adult reserved seat tickets schools could order for the "B" tournament from 6 to 10. Decided to sell 1,000 adult bleacher tickets in the balcony for the "B" tournament.

Television of the "B" tournament was allowed, no charge, since the "B" tournament was "sold out."

Hired Supt. D. W. Evans of Kadoka as Assistant Executive Secretary to start July 1, 1962.

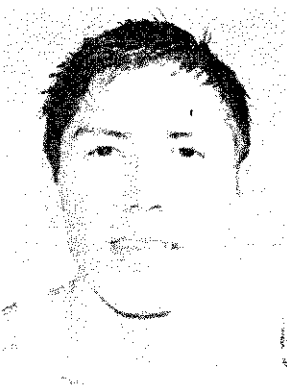

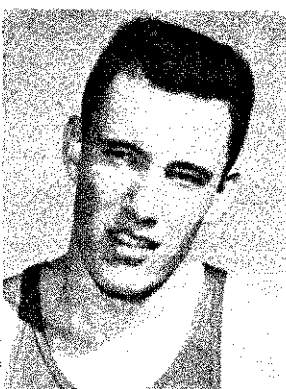

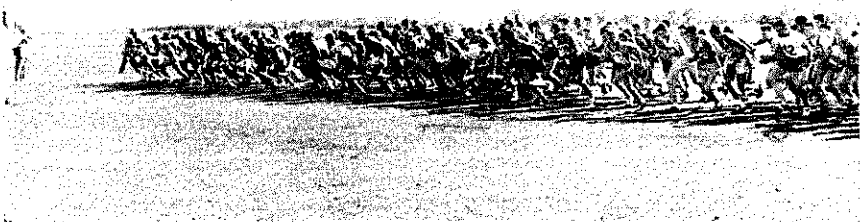

HISTORY OF BASKETBALL TOURNAMENTS

The SDHSAA was organized in 1905 and from that time until 1912, competition was pretty much limited, on a statewide basis, to track and debate. In 1912, with permission of the SDHSAA, Huron College sponsored a state high school basketball tournament, open to all high schools in the State. This tournament was continued annually to 1917, when, at the request of the College, the management was taken over by the Board of Control of the SDHSAA and has been under the supervision and management of the Board since that time. The number of teams in the State Tournament varied until 1924 when eight teams qualified. Since 1924 the State Tournaments have been eight team affairs, with exceptions in 1939, 1940 and 1941 when the "A" Tournaments were four team tournaments.

During the 1920's there was agitation for two classes, and in 1930 an "A" and "B" plan was tried. Under this plan the State was divided into 32 districts and the 32 district winners went to eight "A" Regions, and the eight Region winners then qualified for the State "A" Tournament. The 32 District runners-up qualified for eight "B" Regions, from which the eight winners qualified for the State "B" Tournament. This plan did not prove popular and was abandoned after the one year trial.

Agitation continued for two classes, and in the fall of 1935 an "A" and "B" plan was developed. Under this plan High Schools with an enrollment of 300 and over were classed as "A" schools and all other schools were "B" schools. Under this set-up the top schools in the E.S.D. Conference qualified for the "A" Tournament, and the teams in the second division of this Conference played against the other "A" schools to

determine the other qualifiers in the eight team State "A" Tournament. "B" teams with outstanding records were allowed to challenge into the "A" class for the right to enter the State "A" Tournament. The first "A" and "B" Tournaments were held in March of 1936.

With adjustments from time to time in the "A" set-up, including, taking away the right of a "B" school to challenge, and taking away the method of qualifying by being one of the top teams in the E.S.D. Conference, the present plan was adopted for the 1951-1952 season. During the transition from 1936 to 1951, the four largest schools in four geographical areas were classed as "A" schools and in each of the four sections, two teams from each section qualified for the State "A" Tournament by a double elimination method.

In 1951 the present plan was started whereby the 32 largest high schools, by enrollments, made up the "A" group and eight "A" sections were set up, and the winner of each of the eight section tournaments qualified for the State "A" Tournament. Also part of the present "A" set-up is that, while enrollments might change, the teams were determined on the two-year basis, rather than having changes annually in each class.

For the 1961 "A" Tournaments a change was made in the method of qualifying teams to the State "A" Tournament. This change, briefly was as follows: The make up of schools in the "A" Sections was left as it had been in recent years, however a double elimination Section Tournament was played with two teams from each section qualifying for the new "Sub-State" tournaments. Sections 1 and 2 formed Sub-State #1; Sections 3 and 4 formed Sub-State #2; Sections 5 and 6 formed Sub-State #3; and Sections 7 and 8 formed Sub-State #4. This placed four teams in each of the four Sub-State Tournaments and again double elimination tournaments were played with two teams from each Sub-State tournament qualifying for the State "A" Tournament.

The 1961 plan for "A" tournaments was discarded in 1962 and qualification for places in the State "A" Tournament was done by single elimination tournaments in each of eight (8) "A" Sections. The winner of each "A" Section qualified for the State "A" Tournament.

Since the start of the "A" and "B" classification in 1936 there has been little change in the "B" set-up. We have continued to have 32 "B" Districts and 8 "B" Regions with the eight "B" Region winners qualifying for the State "B" Tournament. Of course there has had to be changes in districts and regions but the basic plan has been kept over the years.

THE 1962 TOURNAMENTS

The 1962 State "A" and "B" Basketball Tournaments are now history, both tournaments were crowd pleasers and the crowds were there. When the firing was over The Oglala Community High School "Thorpes" were the "B" Champions and the Brookings High School "Bobcats" were the "A" Champions. The Championship for the "Thorpes" was their second "B" crown. Their school was the Champion in the first "B" Tournament, under the present set up, in 1936.

For Brookings the "A" Championship was their third, the Bobcats had previously won in 1946 and in 1952.

The Oglala team was a very interesting team and an outstanding team. This all Indian team, possessed clever ball handlers, fine shooters and was a sound team defensively as well. They were quick and accurate

and quickly capitalized on their opponents errors. A well coached team, thoroughly versed in sound fundamentals and blessed with that ability to take advantage of their opponents, when the opportunity presented itself. The team displayed great courage, in fact, in their first round game in the tournament they came from behind 42-31 at the end of the third quarter and went on to win in an overtime game.

Our congratulations to this great team and to their fine coach. They are a worthy addition to the long line of fine "B" Champions.

In the "A" Tournament, action was fast and furious and after it was all over, the Brookings High School "Bobcats" emerged the winner.

The Brookings team was a sound team, had good height, a good bench, possessed good shooters, and were very tough on both boards. The team was well coached and the players responded quickly to their opportunities.

As so aptly expressed by one of the veteran coaches, no team has won the "A" Championship in the last ten years without the good big man and Brookings had that man.

It would be impossible to give too much credit to the coaches of these two fine championship teams, Charles Gustafson of Oglala and Dal Eisenbraun of Brookings. They had their teams ready for the tournaments. Both teams knew what they had to do, both offensively and defensively and both teams were alert to take advantage of their opponents errors. Both Gustafson and Eisenbraun are a credit to their profession, they are fine teachers and each had control of his team as well as the confidence of the players.

Again our congratulations to Oglala and Brookings. They deserved the championships and all the honors that go with winning. We know all the honors will be accepted in the proper manner and the game of basketball will be benefited because of these two fine young men.

Before forgetting the tournaments, we must remember there were seven other teams in each tournament, and if the draw had been different, if breaks had been different, it is possible that several other schools could have been the champions. Look at the records! Murdo might have eliminated Oglala in the first round. McIntosh could have won in the finals. Bridgewater also caused trouble for the champions. In the "A," Rapid City, lost a heartbreaker to Washington High School, Sisseton was defeated in an overtime by Washington High. So you can easily see that a better bounce of the ball could have produced another champion. After all, all this is what makes basketball the game it is. You never know!

On other pages of the Bulletin you will find results of District, Region, Section and State Tournaments, including financial reports. Exceedingly bad weather hurt the "B" Districts and Regions, as well as several "A" Sections.

The 1962 "B" State Tournament was held in the new Sioux Falls Arena, with its seating capacity of over 9000, which was filled to capacity for all sessions. The "A" Tournament was again in Huron's fine Arena. Weather kept the first day's attendance down, but the semi-final session and the finals completely filled this fine Arena.

Tournament management in both Sioux Falls and Huron was wonderful and much of the success of the two fine tournaments can be credited to the planning and organization of those in charge at Huron and Sioux Falls. We honestly feel that there is no place in the nation where the management is better than here in South Dakota.
