FOREWORD

The Year Book, published annually after the close of the school year, serves as an annual report of the Executive Secretary and does provide a complete review of events in the school year of 1967-1968. By saving year books, member schools could have a complete summary of the Association since it was formed in December 1905. This does not mean that a Year Book has been published each year since 1905. The first Year Book was published in 1927 and contained a summary of events from the beginning through the school year of 1926-27. The second such publication was in 1934, the third in 1940, again in 1942 and in 1946. Since 1946 the Year Book has been an annual publication.

Pictures of teams and individuals who have participated in or who have won state-wide events are shown. There have been a few missed, because of photographic failures, and this year is no exception, we have missed a few individuals. Their names, of course, will appear in the summaries.

We sincerely hope each school has been and will continue to file their copies of the Year Book as a rather complete history of the Association will be on file in each member school.

Starting July 1, 1937, R. M. Walseth was appointed Executive Secretary of the Association, with office space in the Department of Public Instruction in the Statehouse in Pierre. Because of expansion in the Department of Public Instruction, and a consequent lack of space, it was necessary to move the SDHSAA office. Space was rented in the St. Charles Hotel and the office was moved in January of 1946, where it remained until November 1957. Then it was moved to permanent quarters in the SDEA building at 411 E. Capital Avenue in Pierre.

With the Association changing from an "Athletic Association" to an "Activities Association," it was necessary to add additional help. Mr. D. W. Evans was named Assistant Executive Secretary July 1, 1962, and additional office space was secured in the SDEA building.

Because of the increased activities of the SDHSAA, The Board of Control decided to add another man to the staff and Clar Lilevjen, formerly Athletic Director at the Watertown High School, will be added to the staff on July 1, 1969. With the addition of Mr. Lilevjen, additional office space was necessary and in June of 1969 the offices were moved to the lower level in the SDEA Building.

REVIEW OF SDHSAA EVENTS FOR 1968-1969

The annual audit of the Association's finances is not included because of the time of the year, but the audit is published each year in the Annual Meeting Bulletin which will be issued in mid-September.

On the next few pages you will find mention of these events, with complete summaries and pictures in the proper order later in the book.

1968-1969 was the eighth year that the Association has been operated as an "Activities Association" and therefore the events mentioned and summarized are for all activities, not only athletics. The athletic summaries and pictures the in the first section of the YEAR BOOK, and the section on the other activities in the second section of the book.

Lookilng back over the year, we believe it was a good year, and we are quite proud of the progress shown in the many activities. There seems to be complete harmony existing, all conflicts cannot be etntirely eliminated but we feel great progress has been made.

Even though all activities are directed from a central office, these activities could not b eeffectively administered without the use of committees made up of the dedicated people who are interested in seing that the particular activity does go well. 1968-1969 SDHSAA EVENTS ATHLETIC

1968 COACHING SCHOOL Huron, August 12, 13, 14, 1968

Over 250 coaches attended the 1968 Annual Tuition-Free SDHSAA Coaching School and were well rewarded for their attendance. We believe the school was great and continues to be one of the best in the Nation. The talent included Pepper Rodgers of Kansas, whose team played in the 1969 "Orange Bowl." Larry Glass of Northwestern headed the basketball end of the school, with "Chuck" Patten of the University of Northern Iowa handling the wrestling. In addition, Coaches Bill Hennrich of Arlington and Ken Thury of Brookings, Coaches of our 1968 "B" and "A" Basketball Championship teams also were a part of the program.

For the fourth year the South Dakota Medical Association provided the Monday afternoon session of the Clinic, with Dr. H. L. Saylor of Huron and Dr. Harvard Lewis of Mitchell arranging the session. They provided Dr. Paul Goetowski, Team Physician for the University of Nebraska athletic teams, and George Sullivan, Head Trainer at the University of Nebraska. These four men did great jobs demonstrating and lecturing on "Medical Aspects in Sports."

All sessions were in the air-conditioned "Elks Ballroom" in the Marvin Hughitt Hotel.

1968 FOOTBALL RULES MEETINGS

Since 1938, with the exception of a couple of World War II years, Football Rules Meetings have been held continuously. The 1968 meetings were held in Aberdeen, Brookings, Custer, Faith, Huron, Mitchell, Mobridge, Philip, Pierre, Sioux Falls, Sturgis, Vermillion, Wagner, Watertown, and Winner.

Three hundred thirty-five officials, 348 coaches, and 271 others interested in football rules attended the meetings which were conducted by Mr. Evans and Mr. Walseth. These meetings will be continued in 1969 at the same sites.

BOARD OF CONTROL MEETING

Sioux Falls-October 8, 1968

The first regular meeting of the Board of Control for the school year of 1968-1969 was held in Sioux Falls on the day prior to the Annual Meeting of the Association. Mr. Walseth and Mr. Evans made reports to the Board and routine matters were handled. A complete summary of the Board of Control Actions will be found on other pages of this "YEAR BOOK," and the entire Minutes will be printed in the September 1969 Annual Meeting Bulletin.

THE ANNUAL SDHSAA MEETING

Lincoln Senior High School Auditorium, Sioux Falls

October 9, 1968

Thirty-five (35) member schools of the SDHSAA were officially represented by one or more delegates at the Annual Meeting of the Association. Reports on the previous school year, plans for the future and an explanation of the budget were made by Executive Secretary R. M. Walseth.

But one amendment to the Athletic By-Laws of the Association had been previously presented and this was about possible football championships in the future. This amendment was quite thoroughly discussed at the meeting. The amendment, as discussed at the meeting, was defeated in referendum balloting which followed the meeting.

Nominations for a Board Member to a new position on the Board of Control from a Division I school were made, and the nominees for this six year term were Principal Virgil Bell of Brookings and Principal Bruce Crockett of Mitchell. The term will start July 1, 1969 and end June 30, 1975. By mail vote Mr. Crockett was elected. Nominations for a five year term, starting July 1, 1969 and ending June 30, 1974 were next made and the nominees to be "At Large" members. Supt. Deane Antoine of Dell Rapids and Supt. Warren Thommen of North Brown County were nominated, and in mail balloting following the meeting, Mr. Antoine was the winner.

Supt. Kenneth Hauge of Sturgis was the only nominee for election to an unexpired term ending June 30, 1970. Mr. Hauge was then declared elected.

1968 CROSS COUNTRY RUN

Brookings, South Dakota—October 18, 1968

Despite adverse weather conditions, the 1968 Cross Country Run was an outstanding event. For the second year the Meet was run in three classes. Snow covered most of the course, water filled the low spots and a cold wind also hampered the runners.

One hundred two runners from sixteen schools competed in the Class "AA" event. One hundred twenty-six runners from 26 schools participated in the Class "A" event and 150 runners from 39 schools in the Class "B" event. This totals 378 runners from \$1 schools.

Rick Birdin Ground of the Flandreau Indian School was the individual winner in Class "AA" and the Flandreau Indian School Team won the team event. Myron Young Dog of the Oglala Community High School won the individual title in class "A" with Cheyenne-Eagle Butte taking the Class "A" team honors. Loren Kambestad of Bristol won the individual honors in Class "B" with Cresbard the winner of team honors in this class.

The Meet was again managed by Coach Aubrey Dooley of the State University. He and his able crew did a fantastic job under very trying conditions. A complete summary of the three meets with pictures will be found on other pages of this "YEAR BOOK."

1968 BASKETBALL RULES MEETINGS

As for football, the SDHSAA has had meetings on rules for basketball coaches, officials and others interested, continuously since 1938, with the exception of the World War II years. The meetings in 1968 were conducted by Executive Secretary R. M. Walseth and Assistant Executive Secretary D. W. Evans in eighteen different cities. Meetings were held in Aberdeen, Chamberlain, Dupree, Hot Springs, Huron, Kadoka, Lake Andes, Lemmon, Madison, Mitchell, Mobridge, Pierre, Sioux Falls, Sisseton, Sturgis, Watertown, Winner and Yankton.

At each of the meetings, rule changes, old rules and officiating procedures were discussed. For the 1968 meetings, 424 officials, 362 coaches, and 232 others, totaling 1018 attended the meetings.

BOARD OF CONTROL MEETING

Sioux Falls-December 27 and 28, 1969

Because there were so many new members on the Board of Control, it was deemed advisable to have an extra Board Meeting before tournament time. Much of the Meeting was spent reviewing procedures and explaining the function and duties of Board Members, and routine business was transacted. RESULTS OF REFERENDUM VOTE ON AMENDMENTS

AND

ELECTION OF BOARD OF CONTROL MEMBERS

As previously mentioned in the notes on the Annual Meeting of the Association, but one amendment was presented and discussed. This Amendment proposed a system of football play-offs. When the mail ballots were counted on January 2, 1969, the vote showed 56 for the Amendment and 154 against. Therefore, the Amendment was defeated.

For election of Board of Control Members, there were two contests. For a six (6) year term starting July 1, 1969 and ending June 30, 1975, Principal Bruce Crockett of Mitchell defeated Principal Virgil A. Bell of Brookings. These men were nominated from Division I schools.

For a five year term starting July 1, 1969 and ending June 30, 1974, the candidates were from the "At Large" classification. Supt. Deane Antoine of Dell Rapids defeated Supt. Warren Thommen of North Brown County (Frederick).

For a one year term to finish the unexpired term of former Supt. A. H. Mortenson of Belle Fourche, Supt. Kenneth Hauge of Sturgis was the only nominee and was declared elected.

1969 NATIONAL ALLIANCE FOOTBALL RULES MEETING AND

EXECUTIVE OFFICERS' MEETING

Atlanta, Georgia-January 8, 9, 10, 1969

Your Executive Secretary R. M. Walseth and Assistant Executive Secretary D. W. Evans were official delegates to these meetings. Mr. Walseth is a member of the Football Rules Committee and Chairman of the Equipment Sub-Committee of the Football group. He presided at this committee meeting. Mr. Evans is a member of the Game Administration Committee and South Dakota's official delegate to the Non-Athletic Section of the Executive Officers' Meeting.

1969 STATE WRESTLING TOURNAMENT

Huron-February 21 & 22, 1969

Weatherwise, the State Wrestling Tournament created problems. Snow, blowing snow, and all that goes with such weather caused a great loss in revenue and several teams were disqualified for failure to arrive in time for the weigh-ins and the opening matches of the Tournament. Otherwise, the Tournament was a decided success. Wrestlers seem to get better and there is greatly improved crowd interest. Hardy coaches, wrestlers and fans were in Huron for this growing event.

Brookings won the team championship with 50 points. Closely following were Pierre, Rapid City, Watertown, Gregory, Milbank and Huron with 49, 47, 42, 40 and 38 points respectively. Thirty-two schools scored one or more points in the Tournament. Thirteen other schools participated in the Tournament and did not score.

Clyde Cotton, Athletic Director of the Huron High School, was the Tournament Manager and he and his staff did a remarkable job.

These schools were the schools which were not allowed to participate in the 1969 State Wrestling Tournament at Huron February 21 and 22 because of late arrival. There was lengthy discussion and plans were formulated to take care of similar situations should they ever arise again in the future. It was decided at the Saturday, March 15 Meeting to add another member to the SDHSAA Staff and to have a meeting of the 32 "A" Basketball schools in Huron on March 29 to set up the "A" Sections for the year of 1969-1970 and 1970-1971.

Finally, Mr. Lilevjen was unanimously elected. At a Board Meeting Saturday morning, May 17, Mr. Lilevjen met with the Board and many matters were discussed. Work assignments were partially listed.

1969 STATE TRACK MEET Rapid City—May 16 & 17, 1969

Rather cool and quite windy weather prevailed for the 62nd Annual running of the State Track and Field Meet, and the Meet was run for the first time in three classes. One thousand eight competitors actually took part. The Meet was also run for the first time on the South Dakota School of Mines and Technology new all-weather track. Showers late in the final afternoon did not hurt the running events. All "B" records are new records, and several "A" and "AA" records were broken or tied, with new all time state records set in the High Hurdles, 880-Yard Relay, 880-Yard Run, Mile Relay, Shot Put, and Discus Throw. The Discus Throw of 211' 4" by George Amundson of Aberdeen Central, exceeded the National High School record by over eleven feet.

Regular routine business was conducted, a budget for 1969-1970 was adopted, and plans for 1969-1970 were made. The 1970 State Track Meet, the Golf and Tennis Tournaments were awarded to Rapid City and the Girls' State Track Meet and the Golf and Tennis Tournaments were awarded to Mitchell. BOARD OF CONTROL ACTIONS

1968-1969

The duly elected governing body of the South Dakota High School Activities Association, known as the Board of Control, held three regular meetings and three special meetings during 1968-69.

During this school year, Dr. M. A. Auld, Yankton, served as chairman of the Board with Deane Antoine, Dell Rapids, serving as vice chairman. Other members of the Board for all of this period or a part of it included Harold Ashbaugh, Vermillion, retiring chairman; A. H. Mortenson, Belle Fourche, retiring vice chairman; A. A. Thompson, Pierre; Maurice Haugland, Murdo; Leo Uken, Bridgewater; Don Flakus, Menno; and Kenneth Hauge, Sturgis.

Turnover in Board membership during the past two years has been greater than normal. When school opened in the fall of 1968 only Dr. Auld, the present chairman, had been a member of the Board in the fall of 1967. More than the usual number of vacancies occurred during the past two years because of retirement of Board members from their school administrative posts.

Following is a summary of actions taken by the Board of Control during 1968-69:

Awarded the 1969 State Track and Field Meet to Rapid City; adopted the recommendations of the golf coaches on the furnishing of awards and medals and breaking ties; adopted recommendations of tennis coaches for tournament seeding, point system, and awards.

•Authorized the holding of the first South Dakota Girls' State Track and Field Meet at Yankton on May 10, 1969, and adopted regulations governing the girls' track and field program. •Revised state wrestling regulations to better control shifting of wrestlers from one weight class to another; adopted recommendations of wrestling advisory committee for wrestling regulations and alignment of schools into districts and regions.

•Revised system for allocating student tickets at State Class "B" Basketball tournament; revised system for location of seats for holders of adult tickets at State "B" Tournament; limited adult ticket order to State "B" Tournament to two per order.

•Approved present method of selecting officials for state basketball tournaments: directed that a poll of basketball committees be taken to determine sentiment for making uniform basketball awards available through the Association office; authorized plans for televising both state basketball tournaments at increased rates; awarded both state basketball tournaments to Sioux Falls.

•Planned memorial service for Rapid City cheerleaders at State Class "A" Basketball Tournament; revised regulations for distribution of complimentary tickets to state basketball tournaments so that "A" committee members are eligible only for tickets to the "A" tournament and "B" committee members are eligible only for tickets to the "B" tournament.

•Adopted budget of \$98,087.80 for 1968-69; increased travel allowance for SDHSAA business; interpreted by-laws to mean that a non-accredited school could not retain its membership in the Association.

•Authorized secretary to hire high school coaches for the 1969 coaching clinic; awarded the 1969 coaching clinic to Huron; awarded the 1969 track clinic to Mitchell; directed that athletic advisory committees be set up with staggered five-year terms and with one new member to be appointed each year.

•Reprimanded Jefferson and Wakonda High Schools for actions during a 1968 football game which were considered detrimental to the high school athletic program.

•Reaffirmed policy that a group of students from one school competing against a group of students from another school in organized drills of any kind must be classified as a game, must be contracted, and must be counted as part of the allowable schedule; directed that a letter be sent to the administrators of all member schools as to exactly what constitutes a game.

•Authorized meeting of orchestra directors of member schools to formulate a set of policies to be followed in conducting the All-State Orchestra program.

•Aligned the membership of the Association into regions for competition in three classes in track.

•Reviewed action of executive secretary and wrestling committee in barring certain qualifiers for the State Wrestling Tournament from participation because of delayed arrival and set policy for such situations arising in future.

•Held joint meeting with 32 Class "A" schools to realign basketball sections for next two years.

•Hired Clar Lilevjen, Watertown, as a third member of the Association staff in the capacity of an assistant executive secretary.







At the conclusion of play in the 1969 State Basketball Tournaments, two new champions were crowned and these teams were fine teams, well coached, physically strong, and each had the necessary desire and man-power. Onida defeated a good Lennox team in the first round, eliminated Tyndall in the semi-finals, before meeting De Smet in the finals.

Rapid City, the "A" champion, defeated Aberdeen Central in the first round, then took good care of Milbank in the semi-finals, before meeting Brookings in the finals. The final game was a contest between two exceptionally fine basketball teams, each team blessed with outstanding individuals, and the game itself was one of the best final games ever in any State Tournament.

Our congratulations to the schools and their coaches—Jerry Kassin of Onida and Dave Strain of Rapid City. These coaches had their teams ready to play.

The 1969 Tournaments are now history, and the Tournaments continue to get better. The games were interesting, well played and the Tournament management continues to improve.

HISTORY OF BASKETBALL TOURNAMENTS

The SDHSAA was organized in 1905 and from that time until 1912, competition was pretty much limited, on a statewide basis, to track and debate. In 1912, with permission of the SDHSAA, Huron College sponsored a state high school basketball tournament, open to all high schools in the State. This tournament was continued annually to 1917, when, at the request of the College, the management was taken over by the Board of Control of the SDHSAA and has been under the supervision and management of the Board since that time. The number of teams in the State Tournament varied until 1924 when eight teams qualified. Since 1924 the State Tournaments have been eight team affairs, with exceptions in 1939, 1940 and 1941 when the "A" Tournaments were four team tournaments.

During the 1920's there was agitation for two classes, and in 1930 an "A" and "B" plan was tried. Under this plan the State was divided into 32 districts and the 32 district winners went to eight "A" Regions, and the eight Region winners then qualified for the State "A" Tournament. The 32 District runners-up qualified for eight "B" Regions, from which the eight winners qualified for the State "B" Tournament. This plan did not prove popular and was abandoned after the one year trial.

Agitation continued for two classes, and in the fall of 1935 an "A" and "B" plan was developed. Under this plan High Schools with an enrollment of 300 and over were classed as "A" schools and all other schools were "B" schools. Under this set-up the top schools in the E.S.D. Conference qualified for the "A" Tournament, and the teams in the second division of this Conference played against the other "A" schools to determine the other qualifiers in the eight team State "A" Tournament. "B" teams with outstanding records were allowed to challenge into the "A" class for the right to enter the State "A" Tournament. The first "A" and "B" Tournaments were held in March of 1936.

With adjustments from time to time in the "A" set-up, including, taking away the right of a "B" school to challenge, and taking away the method of qualifying by being one of the top teams in the E.S.D. Conference, the present plan was adopted for the 1951-1952 season. During the transition from 1936 to 1951, the four largest schools in four geographical areas were classed as "A" schools and in each of the four sections, two teams from each section qualified for the State "A" Tournament by a double elimination method.

In 1951 the present plan was started whereby the 32 largest high schools, by enrollments, made up the "A" group and eight "A" sections were set up, and the winner of each of the eight section tournaments qualified for the State "A" Tournament. Also part of the present "A" set-up is that, while enrollments might change, the teams were determineed on the two-year basis, rather than having changes annually in each class.

For the 1961 "A" Tournaments a change was made in the method of qualifying teams to the State "A" Tournament. This change, briefly was as follows: The make up of schools in the "A" Sections was left as it had been in recent years, however a double elimination Section Tournament was played with two teams from each section qualifying for the new "Sub-State" tournaments. Sections 1 and 2 formed Sub-State #1; Sections 3 and 4 formed Sub-State #2; Sections 5 and 6 formed Sub-State #3; and Sections 7 and 8 formed Sub-State #4. This placed four teams in each of the four Sub-State Tournaments and again double elimination tournaments were played with two teams from each Sub-State tournament qualifying for the State "A" Tournament. The 1961 plan for "A" tournaments was discarded in 1962 and qualification for places in the State "A" Tournament was done by single elimination tournaments in each of eight (8) "A" Sections. The winner of each "A" Section qualified for the State "A" Tournament. This method was continued for the 1968 and 1969 Tournaments.

Since the start of the "A" and "B" classification in 1936 there has been little change in the "B" set-up. We have continued to have 32 "B" Districts and 8 "B" Regions with the eight "B" Region winners qualifying for the State "B" Tournament. Of course there has had to be changes in districts and regions but the basic plan has been kept over the years.

A total of 503 students and advisers represented 64 schools at the conferences conducted at Yankton, Huron, and Rapid City. In 1967 there were 382 delegates from 51 schools.

1968 Press Convention and Publications Competition

The big event for high school journalists in South Dakota was the Annual Press Convention held on the South Dakota State University campus in Brookings on October 5. Dr. George Phillips and his staff at State planned and operated the convention in their usual efficient style. Highlight of the convention was the announcement of the results of the annual competition in school newspapers and yearbooks.

Sioux Falls Lincoln High School repeated as winner of the sweepstakes award. Both its newspaper and its yearbook were rated at the top in the competition. Twelve other schools earned double All-State honors with their publications.

Runners-up in the competition were Sioux Falls Washington, Rapid City Public, Huron, Webster, Howard, Rapid City St. Martin's, Britton, Freeman Public, Ipswich, Strandburg, Midland, and Highmore. A complete list of the award winners in the contest will be found elsewhere in THE YEARBOOK.

One-Act Play Contests

The number of schools participating in the one-act play program dropped slightly from the number taking part in 1967-68. A total of 51 participated as compared with 60 last year.

Contest regulations were revised for 1968-69 so that all participating schools had to enter the division contests to earn their way to the state contest.

Seven schools earned superior ratings in the state contest at Huron. They were:

Other schools competing at Huron were Yankton Mt. Marty, Huron, Gregory, Clark, Sturgis, and Sioux Falls Washington. The state contest had to be postponed one week due to bad weather.

Region Music Contests

Membership of the South Dakota High School Activities Association is divided into eight regions for conducting music contests. Actually, these contests are in the nature of a festival in that each individual or group is striving for a rating with no restrictions placed upon the judges as to the number of ratings which may be awarded in each category. There is no advancement to a state contest.

Contests were held in all eight regions again in 1968-69. In six of the regions solo and ensemble contests were completed in February and were followed by large group contests either the last weekend of March or the second weekend in April. Region IV held all its con-

tests during a two-day event in April. Region VIII held its solo and ensemble contests in early April and its large group contest in May. Regions I, II, and V had separate vocal and instrumental contests in February.

Brookings and Doland Debaters Win State Titles

Debaters from Brookings and Doland took top honors in the state high school debate tournament which wound up the Association's speech program on the campus of Dakota Wesleyan University in Mitchell the middle of March.

Doland won its fifth consecutive Class "B" debate title and ninth in 11 years by defeating Salem Public High School in the finals. Don Mendel coached the Doland speakers and Carl Swanson, the runner-up Salem debaters.

Brookings won the Class "A" championship by defeating Pierre in the final round. Pierre had defeated Brookings earlier in the tournament and went into the finals undefeated. Brookings proceeded to beat Pierre twice to win the title. Brookings had finished in the runner-up spot in 1968. Joe Farnham coached the winning Brookings debaters and Dick Johnson, the runner-up Pierre squad.

Fifty schools competed in the Association's division forensics contests. This included 24 in Class "A" and 26 in Class "B." Class "A" schools qualifying for the state debate tournament were Pierre, Sioux Falls Washington, Sioux Falls Lincoln, Aberdeen Central, Madison, Sturgis, Watertown, and Brookings. Qualifiers for Class "B" included Freeman Public, Tyndall, Doland, Avon, Highmore, Salem Public, Newell, and Volga Sioux Valley.

The question for debate throughout the season and for the tournaments was Resolved: That the United States should establish a system of compulsory service for all citizens.

Results of the original oratory and extemporaneous speaking contests will be found elsewhere in THE YEARBOOK.

All-State Band

Dr. Gene A. Braught, director of bands at the University of Oklahoma, was guest conductor of the 1969 All-State Band. Sturgis High School was host for the 1969 event, and Leo Getsgo, director of instrumental music at the Sturgis school, was general chairman. Robert C. Merritt, a Sturgis High School graduate and a student at the University of Denver, was guest soloist on the trumpet.

One hundred seventy musicians from 66 high schools earned membership in the band through auditions conducted at 11 centers in the state. Auditions and the All-State event itself were planned and operated through the cooperative efforts of the South Dakota Bandmasters' Association and the SDHSAA.












