
Dedication

Starting July 1, 1937, R. M. Walseth was appointed Executive Secretary of the Association, with office space in the Department of Public Instruction in the Statehouse in Pierre. Because of expansion in the Department of Public Instruction, and a consequent lack of space, it was necessary to move the SDHSAA office. Space was rented in the St. Charles Hotel and the office was moved in January of 1946, where it remained until November 1957. Then it was moved to permanent quarters in the SDEA building at 411 E. Capital Avenue in Pierre.

With the Association changing from an "Athletic Association" to an "Activities Association," it was necessary to add additional help. Mr. D. W. Evans was named Assistant Executive Secretary July 1, 1962, and additional office space was secured in the SDEA building.

Because of the increased activities of the SDHSAA, The Board of Control decided to add another man to the staff and Clar Lilevien, formerly Athletic Director at the Watertown High School, will be added to the staff on July 1, 1969. With the addition of Mr. Lilevien, additional office space was necessary and in June of 1969 the offices were moved to the lower level in the SDEA Building.

The new SDEA building is pictured on page 3 of this "YEAR BOOK."

Ralph Wilkinson, former principal at Mobridge High School, will assume the non-athletic duties previously handled by D. W. Evans, Mr. Evans will become Executive Secretary of the Association on July 1, 1970 as R. M. "Bus" Walseth, who has so competently directed the affairs of the Association for thirty-three years, will be retiring.

REVIEW OF SDHSAA EVENTS FOR 1969-1970

This volume of the "YEAR BOOK" contains complete summaries of the statewide events and the business of the SDHSAA for the school year of 1969-1970. The annual audit of the Association's finances is not included because of the time of the year, but the audit is published each year in the Annual Meeting Bulletin which will be issued in mid-September.

1969-1970 was the ninth year that the Association has been operated as an "Activities Association" and therefore the events mentioned and summarized are for all activities, not only athletics. The athletic summaries and pictures are in the first section of the YEAR BOOK, and the section on the other activities in the second section of the book.

Looking back over the year, we believe it was a good year, and we are quite proud of the progress shown in the many activities. There seems to be complete harmony existing, all conflicts cannot be entirely eliminated but we feel great progress has been made.

Even though all activities are directed from a central office, these activities could not be effectively administered without the use of committees made up of the dedicated people who are interested in seeing that the particular activity does go well. 1969-1970 SDHSAA EVENTS

ATHLETIC

1969 COACHING SCHOOL

Huron, August 11, 12, 13, 1969

Over 250 coaches attended the 1969 Annual Tuition-Free SDHSAA Coaching school and were well rewarded for their attendance. We believe the school was great and continues to be one of the best in the Nation. The talent consisted of high school coaches with outstanding records in their respective fields. Sid Cichy, Fargo Shanley and Tom Hancock of Lakewood, Colorado headed the football program. Basketball sessions were conducted by Walt Shublom of Wyandotte High School of Kansas City and Duane Bagelien of Edina, Minnesota. Wrestling was handled by Bob Siddens of Waterloo, Iowa. An added attraction, Dave Strain, coach of our own State "A" Champions, took part in the basketball presentations. For the fifth year the South Dakota Medical Association provided the Monday afternoon session of the Clinic with Dr. H. L. Saylor of Huron arranging the session. Dr. Burton Onofrio, Neurosurgeon from the Mayo Clinic in Rochester, Minnesota, presented a fine program on "Protecting the Health of the Athlete."

All sessions were in the new air-conditioned Huron High School.

1969 FOOTBALL RULES MEETINGS

Since 1938, with the exception of a couple of World War II years, Football Rules Meetings have been held continuously. The 1969 meetings were held in Aberdeen, Brookings, Custer, Faith, Huron, Mitchell, Mobridge, philip, Pierre, Sioux Falls, Sturgis, Vermillion, Wagner, Watertown, and Winner.

383 officials, 368 coaches, and 192 others interested in football rules attended the meetings which were conducted by Mr. Evans and Mr. Walseth. These meetings will be continued in 1970 at the same sites.

BOARD OF CONTROL MEETING

Sioux Falls-October 7, 1969

The first meeting of the Board of Control for the school year of 1969-1970 was held in Sioux Falls on the day prior to the Annual Meeting of the Association. At this meeting routine matters were taken care of and Supt. Maurice Haugland of Wagner was named Chairman of the Board for 1969-1970. Supt. Kenneth Hauge of Sturgis was named the Vice Chairman for the year.

THE ANNUAL SDHSAA MEETING

Washington High School Auditorium

Sioux Falls—October 8, 1969

Seventy-five (75) member schools of the SDHSAA were officially represented by one or more delegates to the Annual Meeting of the Association. Reports were made, the budget for 1969-70 was presented and the Annual Audit was reviewed.

But one amendment to the Athletic By-Laws of the Association had been presented, and this was discussed from the floor at the meeting. In later balloting (by mail) this amendment was passed by a large vote. Briefly, the amendment provided for a three-day advance in the start of pre-season football practice—these three days to be devoted entirely to conditioning, with no contact and with no pads.

There was to be one vacancy on the Board, and the incumbent, Supt. Kenneth Hauge of Sturgis did not wish to be nominated. Supt. Dale Vance of Spearfish was then nominated and there were no other nominations, so Mr. Vance was declared elected. His term is to start July 1, 1970 and to run for six years. The complete minutes of the Annual Meeting will be printed in the September 1970 Annual Meeting Bulletin.

1969 WRESTLING RULES MEETINGS

Eight wrestling rules meetings were held prior to the start of the wrestling season. These meetings were held at Brookings, Miller, Mobridge, Rapid City, Sioux Falls, Webster, Winner and Yankton. Clar Lilevjen, Assistant Executive Secretary, acted as conductor. Despite several blizzards, 68 officials, 106 coaches and 144 other interested persons attended.

1969 CROSS COUNTRY RUN

Brookings, South Daketa—October 17, 1969

The 1969 (24th Annual) Cross Country Run was a splendid event. For the third time the event was run in three Classes, 112 runners from 31 schools taking part in the "B" division, 123 runners from 26 schools in the "A," while 114 runners from 17 schools participated in the "AA" Class.

Weather conditions were not the best, the temperature was 45 degrees and the wind was from the northwest at 10 to 15 miles per hour. Loren Kambestad of Bristol won the "B" event and in doing so he established a "B" record, the event record and the course record, by doing the 2.2 mile course in 10:48.3. Joe Four Bear, Cheyenne-Eagle Butte, won the "A" division with a time of 11:16.7 and Jim Trego of Winner captured the individual title in Class "AA" with 11:14.4 as his time. Team championships were won by the Flandreau Indian School in Class "AA," Cheyenne-Eagle Butte in Class "A" and St. Francis in Class "B."

Jay Dirksen, Track Coach at SDSU, supervised the meets. He and his crew did a superb job of organization and management. A complete summary of the three meets with pictures will be found on other pages of this "Year Book."

1969 BASKETBALL RULES MEETINGS

As for football, the SDSAA has had meetings on rules for basketball coaches, officials and others interested, continuously since 1938, with the exception of the World War II years. The meetings in 1969 were conducted by Executive Secretary R. M. Walseth and Assistant Executive Secretary D. W. Evans in eighteen different cities. Meetings were held in Aberdeen, Chamberlain, Dupree, Hot Springs, Huron, Kadoka, Lake Andes, Lemmon, Madison, Mitchell, Mobridge, Pierre, Sioux Falls, Sisseton, Sturgis, Watertown, Winner and Yankton.

At each of the meetings, rule changes, old rules and officiating procedures were discussed. For the 1969 meetings, 467 officials, 346 coaches, and 168 others, totaling 981 attended the meetings.

St. Charles, Illinois—January 7-8-9, 1970

Mr. Evans is an official member of the Alliance Football Rules Committee and a member of the Game Administration Committee. Both men attended the Rules Meeting and the several sessions for the Executive Officers at this nation-wide meeting.

BOARD OF CONTROL MEETING

Huron-January 28, 1970

The meeting was held to consider Track recommendations presented by the Track Committee and to interview applicants for the new position in the SDHSAA office. Applicants interviewed were Mr. Paul Hedge of Lead, Mr. LeRoy Larson of Wessington Springs, Mr. Jim Smith of Philip, Mr. Robert Sorenson of Frederick, and Mr. Ralph Wilkinson of Mobridge. Mr. Wilkinson was selected for the position.

1970 STATE WRESTLING TOURNMENT

Watertown-February 27 & 28, 1970

A most successful State Wrestling Tournament was held in Watertown. It appears that interest and participation has grown to the extent that wrestling is now a self-supporting activity as far as the Association is concerned.

Sixty-one schools qualified boys for the State Tournament with thirty-eight scoring points. Brookings again won the championship with 63 points followed by Yankton—55, Pierre—49, Sioux Falls Lincoln —42 and Watertown—39.

Jerry Welfl, Atheltic Director at Watertown, and his staff are to be commended for the fine work done in conducting the 1970 tournament.

Due to the rapid growth, 1971 will see wrestling split into "A" and "B" classes with separate State Tournaments being held for each class.

STATE "B" BASKETBALL TOURNAMENT

Sioux Falls-March 12-13-14, 1970

A complete summary of the "B" State Tournament with pictures and records will be found in the Basketball Section of this "Year Book." The 1970 "B" Tournament was won by De Smet, defeating Stickney in the finals. Attendance at the "B" is governed by the size of the Arena, so attendance records could not be broken. However, receipts were considerably higher because of a ticket price increase and more funds from television.

The Board of Control, the governing body of the SDHSAA, had three regular meetings during the year and held one special meeting during the school year of 1969-1970.

• Elected Supt. Maurice Haugland of Wagner Chairman and Supt. Kenneth Hauge of Sturgis as Vice Chairman of the Board of Control and the Association. Other members of the Board of Control were: Dr. M. A. Auld, Yankton; Supt. Deane Antoine, Dell Rapids; Prin. Bruce Crockett, Mitchell; Supt. Don Flakus, Menno; and Supt. Leo F. Uken, Bridgewater. Supt. Dale Vance of Spearfish was elected to membership on the Board to succeed Supt. Hauge who did not seek reelection to the term for which he was still eligible.

Placed Tri-Valley (Lyons), Montrose and Tabor High Schools on probation for one year for the violation of early season football games and practice.

• Divided Wrestling into two classes—Class "A" and Class "B" with the "A" Tournament assigned to Huron and the "B" Tournamtnt to Mitchell.

• Set up qualifications for a new man in the SDHSAA who will take over the Non-Athletic Activities of the Association.

• Set up guidelines for a Policy Handbook for Board of Control and Staff Members.

Assigned the 1970 Cross Country Run to Brookings.

• Authorized securing uniform medals for District, Region, and Section Basketball Tournaments, such medals to be ordered and paid for by the individual District, Region, and Section Tournament Committees.

• Named Assistant Executive Secretary D. W. Evans as the Executive Secretary, replacing Executive Secretary R. M. Walseth, effective July 1, 1970. Assistant Executive Secretary Clar Lilevjen was assigned duties in the field of Athletics, and the new Assistant Executive Secretary is to be in the Non-Athletic field.

• Decided to prepare a "Policy Handbook" for the Association officers and staff.

• Decided to prepare an amendment for submission to the member of the Association making the schools alike in "A" Wrestling, "AA" Track, and "A" Basketball, and each running for a two-year period.

• Eliminated the third faster than a first for qualifying for the State Track Meet.

• Changed some standards set up for qualification to the State Track Meet.

Revised regulations on Pole Vault qualifiers.

• Authorized the use of anemometers for the State Track Meets.

• Interviewed applicants for the new position in the SDHSAA office, set salaries and benefits and hired Principal Ralph W. Wilkinson of Mobridge as the new Assistant Executive Secretary.

• Approved television for Championship round games in the State "B" Basketball Tournament and for the last two nights of the "A" Tournament.

• Schools were set up into regions for Wrestling, Track and Girls' Track.

• Set the annual dates for the Cross Country Run as the last Friday in October.

• Set the annual dates for the State Track Meet, the State Tennis and Golf Tournaments. The wind-up of these events is to be on the fourth Saturday in May.

• Assigned the "B" and "A" Basketball Tournaments for 1971 to Sioux Falls.

• Assigned the "A" Wrestling Tournament to Huron and the "B" to Mitchell.

• Increased the number of tickets held for qualifying schools in both basketball Tournaments.

Salaries were set for all employees for 1970-1971.

• Named members to Advisory Committees on Wrestling, Track, Girls' Track, Speech, Music, Student Council, and Press.

• Set up Golf Regions independent of the Track Committees and set up new Golf Committees.

Assigned the State Track Meet and Tennis Tournament for 1971 to Sioux Falls and the Golf Tournament to Watertown.

• Approved parts of Policy Handbook.

Adopted a budget for 1970-71.

• Decided to assess "B" District Tournaments five per cent (5%) of the receipts and the "B" Region and "A" Section Tournaments ten per cent (10%) of their receipts.





At the conclusion of play in the 1970 State Basketball Tournaments, two new champions were crowned and these were fine teams, well coached, physically strong and each had the necessary desire and manpower. De Smet defeated Clark in the first round, eliminated Hurley in the semi-finals, before meeting Stickney in the final game.

Sioux Falls Lincoln, the "A" champion, defeated Rapid City Central in the first game, then took care of Spearfish in the second round and edged a strong Yankton team in the finals. The final game was a contest between two fine teams, each blessed with oustanding individuals. The game tself was one of the best final games in any State Tournament.

Our congratulations to the schools and their coaches— Larry Luitjens of De Smet and Floyd Farrand of Sioux Falls Lincoln. These coaches had their teams ready to play.

Wally Diehl and his staff, as usual, did a great job of putting on two outstanding tournaments.

On other pages of this "Year Book" you will find scores of all games in the two tournaments and pictures of the teams with their season's records.

HISTORY OF BASKETBALL TOURNAMENTS

The SDHSAA was organized in 1905 and from that time until 1912, competition was pretty much limited, on a statewide basis, to track and debate. In 1912, with permission of the SDHSAA. Huron College sponsored a state high school basketball tournament, open to all high schools in the State. This tournament was continued annually to 1917, when, at the request of the College, the management was taken over by the Board of Control of the SDHSAA and has been under the supervision and management of the Board since that time. The number of teams in the State Tournament varied until 1924 when eight teams qualified. Since 1924 the State Tournaments have been eight team affairs, with exceptions in 1939, 1940 and 1941 when the "A" Tournaments were four team tournaments.

During the 1920's there was agitation for two classes, and in 1930 an "A" and "B" plan was tried. Under this plan the State was divided into 32 districts and the 32 district winners went to eight "A" Regions, and the eight Region winners then qualified for the State "A" Tournament. The 32 District runners-up qualified for eight "B" Regions, from which the eight winners qualified for the State "B" Tournament. This plan did not prove popular and was abandoned after the one year trial.

Agitation continued for two classes, and in the fall of 1935 an "A" and "B" plan was developed. Under this plan High Schools with an enrollment of 300 and over were classed as "A" schools and all other schools were "B" schools. Under this set-up the top schools in the E.S.D. Conference qualified for the "A" Tournament, and the teams in the second division of this Conference played against the other "A" schools to determine the other qualifiers in the eight team State "A" Tournament. "B" teams with outstanding records were allowed to challenge into the "A" class for the right to enter the State "A" Tournament. The first "A" and "B" Tournaments were held in March of 1936.

With adjustments from time to time in the "A" set-up, including, taking away the right of a "B" school to challenge, and taking away the method of qualifying by being one of the top teams in the E.S.D. Conference, the present plan was adopted for the 1951-1952 season. During the transition from 1936 to 1951, the four largest schools in four geographical areas were classed as "A" schools and in each of the four sections, two teams from each section qualified for the State "A" Tournament by a double elimination method.

In 1951 the present plan was started whereby the 32 largest high schools, by enrollments, made up the "A" group and eight "A" sections were set up, and the winner of each of the eight section tournaments qualified for the State "A" Tournament. Also part of the present "A" set-up is that, while enrollments might change, the teams were determined on the two-year basis, rather than having changes annually in each class.

For the 1961 "A" Tournaments a change was made in the method of qualifying teams to the State "A" Tournament. This change, briefly was as follows: The make up of schools in the "A" Sections was left as it had been in recent years, however a double elimination Section Tournament was played with two teams from each section qualifying for the new "Sub-State" tournaments. Sections 1 and 2 formed Sub-State #1; Sections 3 and 4 formed Sub-State #2; Sections 5 and 6 formed Sub-State #3: and Sections 7 and 8 formed Sub-State #4. This placed four teams in each of the four Sub-State Tournaments and again double elimination tournaments were played with two teams from each Sub-State tournament qualifying for the State "A" Tournament. The 1961 plan for "A" tournaments was discarded in 1962 and qualification for places in the State "A" Tournament was done by single elimination tournaments in each of eight (8) "A" Sections. The winner of each "A" Section qualified for the State "A" Tournament. This method has been continued through the 1970 Tournaments.

Since the start of the "A" and "B" classification in 1936 there has been little change in the "B" set-up. We have continued to have 32 "B" Districts and 8 "B" Regions with the eight "B" Region winners qualifying for the State "B" Tournament. Of course there has had to be changes in districts and regions but the basic plan has been kept over the years.



1969 Press Convention and Publications Competition

Again the big event for high school journalists in South Dakota was the annual press convention held on the South Dakota State University campus in Brookings on September 27. Dr. George Phillips and his staff at the University planned and operated the convention in their usual efficient manner. Highlight of the convention was the announcement of the results of the annual competition in school newspapers and yearbooks.

For the third consecutive year Sioux Falls Lincoln won the sweepstakes award. Its newspaper was rated the top one in the contest. and its yearbook ranked third among the All-State selections. Only five schools earned double All-State honors with their publications.

REGION MUSIC CONTESTS

Membership of the South Dakota High School Activities Association is divided into eight regions for conducting music contests. Actually, these contests are in the nature of a festival in that each individual or group is striving for a rating with no restrictions placed upon the judges as to the number of superior ratings which may be awarded in each category. There is no advancement to a state contest.

Contests were held in all eight regions again in 1969-70. In six of the regions solo and ensemble contests were completed in February and were followed by large group contests either the first or third weekends of April. Region IV held all its contests during a two-day event the first weekend in April. Region VIII held its solo and ensemble contests in early April and its large group contest the first Saturday in May. Regions I, II , and V had separate vocal and instrumental contests in February. Region III had no large group contest.

Milbank and Salem Debaters Win State Titles

Debaters from Milbank and Salem took top honors in the state high school debate tournament which wound up the Association's speech program on the campus of Northern State College at Aberdeen the middle of March. These championships were "firsts" for both Milbank and Salem.

Salem, after being runner-up the previous year, defeated Groton in the finals to take the Class "B" crown. Carl Swanson coached the Salem debaters, and John Westby, the runner-up Groton speakers.

Milbank went through the state tournament undefeated to win the Class "A" championship. In the championship debate Milbank defeated Watertown 4 to 1. Cal Cooper coached the winning Milbank team, and Donus Roberts, the runner-up Watertown squad.

Fifty schools competed in the Association's division forensics contests. This included 26 in Class "A" and 24 in Class "B." Class "A" schools qualifying for the state debate tournament were Sioux Falls Lincoln, Parkston, Sturgis, Yankton, Madison, Milbank, Rapid City Central, and Watertown. Qualifiers for Class "B" included Wolsey, Salem, Tripp, Baltic, Clear Lake, Wagner, Groton, and Newell.

The question for debate throughout the season and for the tournaments was, Resolved: That Congress should prohibit unilateral United States military intervention in foreign countries.

Results of the original oratory and extemporaneous speaking contests will be found elsewhere in THE YEARBOOK.

All-State Band

Miles Johnson, director of bands at St. Olaf College, Northfield, Minnesota, was guest conductor for the 1970 All-State Band. Watertown High School was host for the 1970 event, and Doug Carpenter, director of bands at Watertown High School, was general chairman. As secretarytreasurer of the South Dakota Bandmasters Association, Mr. Carpenter also had charge of all auditions for the band.

One hundred sixty-five musicians from 66 schools earned membership in the band through auditions conducted at 11 centers in the state. Auditions and the All-State event itself were planned and operated through the cooperative efforts of the South Dakota Bandmasters Association and the SDHSAA.

Rapid City Stevens High School qualified the most performers for the band, 14; Clark 13; Watertown 9; Aberdeen Central and Groton 8 each; Redfield and Huron 5 each; and Arlington, Beresford, Canton, Hayti, Lead, Mobridge, Sioux Falls Washington, and Vermillion 4 each.

Three members of the 1970 All-State Band received gold medals to mark the fourth straight year of their membership in the band. They are:




