FOREWORD

Additional yearbooks were published in 1934, 1940, 1942, and 1946. Each covered the activities of more than one year. Since 1946 the yearbook has been an annual publication.

1971-1972 SDHSAA EVENTS

ATHLETIC

1971 COACHING SCHOOL

Huron, August 9, 10, 11, 1971

Over 260 coaches attended the 1971 Annual Tuition-Free Coaching School. The talent again consisted of high school coaches with outstanding records in their respective fields. Tom Mahoney, Fairmont, Minnesota and Don Leahy of Creighton Prep, Omaha, Neb., conducted the football sessions. Dave Wolsky, St. Mary's of New England, N. D. and Tom Brosnihan, Creighton Prep, Omaha, Neb., were the basketball instructors. Wrestling was handled by Bob Smith of Wray, Colo. Track sessions were included in the Summer Clinic for the first time. Roy Griak, University of Minnesota track coach, presented the track program.

For the seventh consecutive year, the South Dakota Medical Association provided the talent for the training sessions. Dr. A. J. Janusz of Aberdeen and Dr. H. L. Saylor of Huron again arranged to have the ever popular G. L. "Gordy" Graham, Head Athletic Trainer at Mankato State, act as instructor.

1971 FOOTBALL RULES MEETINGS

The 1971 meetings were held in Aberdeen, Brookings, Custer, Faith, Huron, Mitchell, Mobridge, Philip, Pierre, Sioux Falls, Sturgis, Vermillion, Wagner, Watertown and Winner.

Over 1,000 persons attended these meetings. Meetings will be continued in 1972 at the same sites and will be conducted by Mr. Evans and Mr. Lilevjen.

1971 BASKETBALL RULES MEETINGS

As for football, the SDHSAA has had meetings on rules for basketball coaches, officials and other interested parties, continuously since 1938 with the exception of the World War II years. The 1971 meetings were conducted by Executive Secretary D. W. Evans and Assistant Secretary Clar Lilevjen in 14 different locations. Meetings were held in Aberdeen, Faith, Hot Springs, Huron, Kadoka, Madison, Mitchell, Mobridge, Pierre, Sioux Falls, Sturgis, Watertown, Winner and Yankton. Certified Officials were again used to demonstrate mechanics.

Just under 1,000 persons attended the basketball meetings. Meetings will be at the same sites in 1972.

1971 WRESTLING RULES MEETINGS

Nine wrestling rules meetings were held prior to the start of the wrestling season. These meetings were held at Aberdeen, Huron, Mobridge, Pierre, Rapid City, Sioux Falls, Watertown, Winner, and Yankton and were conducted by Clar Lilevjen, Assistant Executive Secretary of SDHSAA. One hundred twenty-six coaches, 121 officials and 101 other interested persons were in attendance.

1972 TRACK RULES MEETINGS

Three track rules meetings were held during the first week in April. These meetings were conducted on a "Trial Balloon" basis to determine interest. A new film "Track and Field Today" was shown, South Dakota Rules and Regulations gone over and National Federation Rule changes covered. The meetings were well attended and seemed worthwhile.

HISTORY OF BASKETBALL TOURNAMENTS

The SDHSAA was organized in 1905 and from that time until 1912, competition was pretty much limited, on a statewide basis, to track and debate. In 1912, with permission of the SDHSAA, Huron College sponsored a state high school basketball tournament, open to all high schools in the State. This tournament was continued annually to 1917, when, at the request of the College, the management was taken over by the Board of Control of the SDHSAA and has been under the supervision and management of the Board since that time. The number of teams in the State Tournament varied until 1924 when eight teams qualified. Since 1924 the State Tournaments have been eight team affairs, with exceptions in 1939, 1940 and 1941 when the "A" Tournaments were four team tournaments.

During the 1920's there was agitation for two classes, and in 1930 an "A" and "B" plan was tried. Under this plan the State was divided into 32 districts and the 32 district winners went to eight "A" Regions, and the eight Region winners then qualified for the State "A" Tournament. The 32 District runners-up qualified for eight "B" Regions, from which the eight winners qualified for the State "B" Tournament. This plan did not prove popular and was abandoned after the one year trial.

Agitation continued for two classes, and in the fall of 1935 an "A" and "B" plan was developed. Under this plan High Schools with an enrollment of 300 and over were classed as "A" schools and all other schools were "B" schools. Under this set-up the top schools in the E.S.D. Conference qualified for the "A" Tournament, and the teams in the second division of this Conference played against the other "A" schools to determine the other qualifiers in the eight team State "A" Tournament. "B" teams with outstanding records were allowed to challenge into the "A" class for the right to enter the State "A" Tournament. The first "A" and "B" Tournaments were held in March of 1936.

With adjustments from time to time in the "A" set-up, including taking away the right of a "B" school to challenge, and taking away the method of qualifying by being one of the top teams in the E.S.D. Conference, the present plan was adopted for the 1951-1952 season. During the transition from 1936 to 1951, the four largest schools in four geographical areas were classed as "A" schools and in each of the four sections, two teams from each section qualified for the State "A" Tournament by a double elimination method.

In 1951 the present plan was started whereby the 32 largest high schools, by enrollments, made up the "A" group and eight "A" sections were set up, and the winner of each of the eight section tournaments qualified for the State "A" Tournament. Also part of the present "A" set-up is that, while enrollments might change, the teams were determined on the two-year basis, rather than having changes annually in each class.

For the 1961 "A" Tournaments a change was made in the method of qualifying teams to the State "A" Tournament. This change, briefly was as follows: The make up of schools in the "A" Sections was left as it had been in recent years, however a double elimination Section Tournament was played with two teams from each section qualifying for the new "Sub-State" tournaments. Sections 1 and 2 formed Sub-State #1; Sections 3 and 4 formed Sub-State #2; Sections 5 and 6 formed Sub-State #3; and Sections 7 and 8 formed Sub-State #4. This placed four teams in each of the four Sub-State Tournaments and again double elimination tournaments were played with two teams from each Sub-State tournament qualifying for the State "A" Tournament.

The 1961 plan for "A" tournaments was discarded in 1962 and qualification for places in the State "A" Tournament was done by single elimination tournaments in each of eight (8) "A" Sections. The winner of each "A" Section qualified for the State "A" Tournament. This method has been continued through the 1971 Tournaments.

Since the start of the "A" and "B" classification in 1936 there has been little change in the "B" set-up. We have continued to have 32 "B" Districts and 8 "B" Regions with the eight "B" Region winners qualifying for the State "B" Tournament. Of course there has had to be changes in districts and regions but the basic plan has been kept over the years.

Competition on the local level determines which students will attend the chorus. Each school may send one or more quartets based on the enrollment of the school. The orchestra members were selected by auditions which included performance and written tests.

The South Dakota Music Educators' Association cooperated with the SDHSAA in planning and operating this All-State event.

ALL-STATE BAND

Stevens High School, Rapid City, was the host school for the 1972 All-State Band. Milo Winter was the general chairman. Guest conductor of the band was Mr. John P. Paynter, Director of Bands, Northwestern University, Evanston, Illinois.

One hundred and sixty-six students from 59 high schools earned memberships in the band through auditions conducted at 11 audition centers in the state. All phases of the All-State event were planned and operated through the cooperative efforts of the South Dakota Bandmasters Association and the SDHSAA.

Schools that were represented in this year's band were Rapid City Stevens with 14 students, Aberdeen Central—11, Watertown—10, Groton—9. There were five schools with six students each in the band and they were: Arlington, Beresford, Hayti, Madison, and Rapid City Central. Three schools, Clark, Huron, and Lead, each had 4 students playing in the band. REGION MUSIC CONTESTS

The member schools of the South Dakota High School Activities Association are divided into eight regions for conducting music contests. Actually these contests are in the nature of a festival in that each individual or group is striving for a rating with no restrictions placed upon the judges as to the number of superior ratings which may be awarded in each category. There is no advancement to a state contest.

Contests were held in all eight regions again in 1971-72. In seven of the regions, solo and ensemble contests were completed in February and were followed by large group contests either in the second, third or fourth week-ends of April. Region IV held all its contests during the two-day event the first weekend in April. Region VIII held its solo and ensemble contest in early February and its large group contest the last Saturday in April. Regions I, II, and V had separate vocal and instrumental contests in April. Region II had no large group contest.

1972 D. C. REUTTER MEMORIAL AWARDS 1972

The Reutter Award was initiated by the Reutter family in cooperation with the South Dakota Speech Association. The awards were established in the memory of the late D. C. (Doc) Reutter who served as director of forensics at Huron High School from 1927 until 1965. He was also instrumental in building the South Dakota interscholastic forensics program to its present level.

Candidates for the awards are selected on the basis of integrity of ideas, thoroughness of research, ability to communicate ideas in debating, good character, and sportsmanship. In addition to being recognized as an all-state debater, each recipient was awarded a medal.

Starting July 1, 1937, R. M. Walseth was appointed Executive Secretary of the Association, with office space in the Department of Public Instruction in the Statehouse in Pierre. Because of expansion in the Department of Public Instruction, and a consequent lack of space, it was necessary to move the SDHSAA office. Space was rented in the St. Charles Hotel and the office was moved in January of 1946, where it remained until November 1957. Then it was moved to permanent quarters in the SDEA building at 411 E. Capitol Avenue in Pierre.

With the Association changing from an "Athletic Association" to an "Activities Association," it was necessary to add additional help. Mr. D. W. Evans was named Assistant Executive Secretary July 1, 1962, and additional office space was secured in the SDEA building.

Because of the increased activities of the SDHSAA, The Board of Control decided to add another man to the staff and Clar Lilevjen, formerly Athletic Director at the Watertown High School, was added to the staff on July 1, 1969. With the addition of Mr. Lilevjen, additional office space was necessary and in June of 1969 the offices were moved to the lower level in the SDEA Building.

Ralph Wilkinson, former principal at Mobridge High School, assumed the non-athletic duties previously handled by D. W. Evans. Mr. Evans became Executive Secretary of the Association on July 1, 1970 as R. M. "Bus" Walseth, who so competently directed the affairs of the Association for thirty-three years, retired.
