FOREWORD

1973-1974 SDHSAA EVENTS

ATHLETIC

1973 COACHING SCHOOL

Huron, August 6, 7, 8, 1973

More than 300 coaches registered at the twenty-second Annual Tuition-Free Coaching School. We were again fortunate in having outstanding instructors. "Beanie" Cooper, head football coach at Heelan High School, Sioux City, Iowa and "Mel" Klein, head basketball coach at Augustana College, Sioux Falls, S. D. were very well received. Frank Sevigne and John Korky, track coaches at the University of Nebraska, presented most valuable information to the track coaches. The wrestling coaches were privileged to listen to and work with "Bob" Siddens, top high school wrestling coach from West High School, Waterloo, Iowa.

We owe our sincere thanks to the South Dakota Chapter of the American College of Surgeons, especially Dr. A. J. Janusz and Dr. H. L. Saylor for arranging and providing the talent for the training portion of our program. "Rob" Williams, Physical Therapist and Athletic Trainer from the University of South Dakota, did an outstanding job in helping the coaches with their problems.

1973 FOOTBALL RULES MEETINGS

The 1973 meetings were held in Aberdeen, Brookings, Custer, Faith, Huron, Mitchell, Mobridge, Philip, Pierre, Sioux Falls, Sturgis, Ver-

million, Wagner, Watertown and Winner. Nearly 1,100 persons attended these meetings. Meetings will be conducted at the same sites in 1974 and will be conducted by Mr. Evans and Mr. Lilevjen.

1973 BASKETBALL RULES MEETINGS

As for football, the SDHSAA has had meetings on rules for basketball coaches, officials and other interested parties, continuously since 1938 with the exception of the World War II years. The 1973 meetings were conducted by D. W. Evans and Clar Lilevjen in 14 different locations. Meetings were held in Aberdeen, Faith, Hot Springs, Huron, Kadoka, Madison, Mitchell, Mobridge, Pierre, Sioux Falls, Sturgis, Watertown, Winner and Yankton. 1,108 person attended the basketball meetings. Meetings will be at the same sites in 1974.

1973 WRESTLING RULES MEETINGS

One clinic and eight rules meetings were held for wrestling coaches, officials, and the public. Frank Kurtenbach, member of the National Federation Wrestling Rules Committee, conducted the clinic at Mitchell. Rules meetings were held at Aberdeen, Mobridge, Pierre, Rapid City, Sioux Falls, Watertown, Winner and Yankton. Over 100 persons attended the clinic. One hundred fifty-three coaches, 129 officials and 117 other interested persons attended the rules meetings. Clar Lilevjen conducted the rules meetings.

HISTORY OF BASKETBALL TOURNAMENTS

The SDHSAA was organized in 1905 and from that time until 1912, competition was pretty much limited, on a statewide basis, to track and debate. In 1912, with permission of the SDHSAA, Huron College sponsored a state high school basketball tournament, open to all high schools in the State. This tournament was continued annually to 1917, when, at the request of the College, the management was taken over by the Board of Control of the SDHSAA and has been under the supervision and management of the Board since that time. The number of teams in the State Tournament varied until 1924 when eight teams qualified. Since 1924 the State Tournaments have been eight team affairs, with exceptions in 1939, 1940 and 1941 when the "A" Tournaments were four team tournaments.

During the 1920's there was agitation for two classes, and in 1930 an "A" and "B" plan was tried. Under this plan the State was divided into 32 districts and the 32 district winners went to eight "A" Regions, and the eight Region winners then qualified for the State "A" Tournament. The 32 District runners-up qualified for eight "B" Regions, from which the eight winners qualified for the State "B" Tournament. This plan did not prove popular and was abandoned after the one year trial.

Agitation continued for two classes, and in the fall of 1935 an "A" and "B" plan was developed. Under this plan High Schools with an enrollment of 300 and over were classed as "A" schools and all other schools were "B" schools. Under this set-up the top schools in the E.S.D. Conference qualified for the "A" Tournament, and the teams in the second division of this Conference played against the other "A" schools to determine the other qualifiers in the eight team State "A" Tournament. "B" teams with outstanding records were allowed to challenge into the "A" class for the right to enter the State "A" Tournament. The first "A" and "B" Tournaments were held in March of 1936.

With adjustments from time to time in the "A" set-up, including taking away the right of a "B" school to challenge, and taking away the method of qualifying by being one of the top teams in the E.S.D. Conference, the present plan was adopted for the 1951-1952 season. During the transition from 1936 to 1951, the four largest schools in four geographical areas were classed as "A" schools and in each of the four sections, two teams from each section qualified for the State "A" Tournament by a double elimination method.

In 1951 the present plan was started whereby the 32 largest high schools, by enrollments, made up the "A" group and eight "A" sections were set up, and the winner of each of the eight section tournaments qualified for the State "A" Tournament. Also part of the present "A" set-up is that, while enrollments might change, the teams were determined on the two-year basis, rather than having changes annually in each class.

For the 1961 "A" Tournaments a change was made in the method of qualifying teams to the State "A" Tournament. This change, briefly was as follows: The make up of schools in the "A" Sections was left as it had been in recent years, however a double elimination Section Tournament was played with two teams from each section qualifying for the new "Sub-State" tournaments. Sections 1 and 2 formed Sub-State #1; Sections 3 and 4 formed Sub-State #2; Sections 5 and 6 formed Sub-State #3; and Sections 7 and 8 formed Sub-State #4. This placed four teams in each of the four Sub-State Tournaments and again double elimination tournaments were played with two teams from each Sub-State tournament qualifying for the State "A" Tournament.

The 1961 plan for "A" tournaments was discarded in 1962 and qualification for places in the State "A" Tournament was done by single elimination tournaments in each of eight (8) "A" Sections. The winner of each "A" Section qualified for the State "A" Tournament. This method has been continued through the 1971 Tournaments.

Since the start of the "A" and "B" classification in 1936 there has been little change in the "B" set-up. We have continued to have 32 "B" Districts and 8 "B" Regions with the eight "B" Region winners qualifying for the State "B" Tournament. Of course there has had to be changes in districts and regions but the basic plan has been kept over the years.

ALL-STATE CHORUS AND ORCHESTRA

The Sioux Falls Arena was the site for the 1973 All-State Chorus and Orchestra. The statistics for the two day event as follows:

Guest conductor for the chorus was Dr. Joseph A. Mussulman. For the past 16 years he has been teaching at the University of Montana. His duties at the U. of Montana included instructor of courses in music history and literature, with emphasis on American music and 20th Century music. Dr. Mussulman conducts the U. of M. "Jubileers"; New man Choir, campus Catholic parish and a civic male chorus, the Mis-soula Mendelssohn Club.

Guest conductor for the orchestra was David Holland from St. Scholastica College in Duluth, Minnesota. Mr. Holland has played with the Charleston Symphony and has had special training and experience with the Suzuki method of teaching Violin and Cello.

Competition on the local level determines which students will attend the chorus. Each school may send one or more quartets based on the enrollment of the school. The orchestra members were selected by auditions which included performance and a written test.

The South Dakota Music Educator's Association cooperated with the SDHSAA in planning and operating this All-State event.

ALL-STATE BAND

The 1974 All-State Band was held at Aberdeen's Civic Arena with Col. Arnald D. Gabriel as guest conductor. Local Chairman for the event was E. Orville Evenson, Aberdeen Central High School band director.

This year's band was composed of 166 students from sixty-two high schools. Members of the band were selected by auditions held at 11 audition centers throughout the state. All phases of the All-State event were planned and operated through the cooperation of the South Dakota Bandmasters' Association and the SDHSAA.

Schools represented in this year's band are: Rapid City Stevens with eighteen students, followed by Aberdeen Central and Vermillion with eight students each. Watertown has seven, Arlington, Huron and Yankton with six each, and four schools with five students in the band are Beresford, Brookings, Madison, and Sioux Falls Lincoln. Clark, Freeman and Lead each have four students in the band. Schools with three or fewer students in the band are: Alcester, Armour, Belle Fourche, Britton, Canton, Castlewood, Centerville, Chamberlain, Clear Lake, Corsica, Cresbard, De Smet, Elk Point, Eureka, Faulkton, Flandreau Public, Gettysburg, Gregory, Groton, Hamlin, Hecla, Highmore, Hitchcock, Hurley, Java, Lake Preston, Leola, Marion, Milbank, Miller, Mitchell, Mobridge, Mellette-Northwestern, Pierre, Platte, Rapid City Central, Redfield, Scotland, Sioux Falls Washington, Volga, Sisseton, Spearfish, Sturgis, Tripp, Warner, Webster, Wessington Springs, Winner.

In the 1974 All-State Band there are 93 seniors, 49 juniors, 11 sophomores, and three freshmen.

The All-State Band had two students who received gold medals for being members of the Band for the past four years. They were Patty Mueller, Milbank and Dave Anderson, Watertown.

REGION MUSIC CONTESTS

The member schools of the SDHSAA are divided into eight regions for conducting music contests. Actually these contests are in the nature of a festival as each individual or group is striving for a rating with no restrictions placed upon the judges as to the number of superior ratings which may be awarded in each category. There is no advancement to a state contest.

All eight regions held contests in 1973-74. In seven of the regions, solo and ensemble contests were held in February. Region I, II, III, and V held no large group contest. Region IV held both the solo and ensemble contest and the large group contest on the same week-end in March.

SPEECH PROGRAMS FOR 1973-74

ORAL INTERPRETATION

The Oral Interpretation program has the largest participation of students of any of the speech activities. Statistics continue to show that the students from the class "B" schools hold their own with those from the class "A" schools in both the division and state Oral Interpretation Contests.

The Reutter Award was initiated by the Reutter family in cooperation with the South Dakota Speech Association. The awards were established in the memory of the late D. C. (Doc) Reutter who served as director of forensics at Huron High School from 1927 until 1965. He was also instrumental in building the South Dakota interscholastic forensic program to its present level.

Candidates for the awards are selected on the basis of integrity of ideas, thoroughness of research, ability to communicate ideas in debating, good character, and sportsmanship. In addition to being recognized as an all-state debater, each recipient was awarded a medal.

Starting July 1, 1937, R. M. Walseth was appointed Executive Secretary of the Association, with office space in the Department of Public Instruction in the Statehouse in Pierre. Because of expansion in the Department of Public Instruction, and a consequent lack of space, it was necessary to move the SDHSAA office. Space was rented in the St. Charles Hotel and the office was moved in January of 1946, where it remained until November 1957. Then it was moved to permanent quarters in the SDEA building at 411 E. Capitol Avenue in Pierre.

With the Association changing from an "Athletic Association" to an "Activities Association," it was necessary to add additional help. Mr. D. W. Evans was named Assistant Executive Secretary July 1, 1962, and additional office space was secured in the SDEA building.

Because of the increased activities of the SDHSAA, The Board of Control decided to add another man to the staff and Clar Lilevjen, formerly Athletic Director at the Watertown High School, was added to the staff on July 1, 1969. With the addition of Mr. Lilevjen, additional office space was necessary and in June of 1969 the offices were moved to the lower level in the SDEA Building.

Ralph Wilkinson, former principal at Mobridge High School, assumed the non-athletic duties previously handled by D. W. Evans. Mr. Evans became Executive Secretary of the Association on July 1, 1970 as R. M. "Bus" Walseth, who so competently directed the affairs of the Association for thirty-three years, retired.
