FOREWORD

This yearbook is published annually after the close of the current school year. Its purpose is to serve as an annual report of the Executive Secretary and to provide a complete review of events sponsored during the year by the Association. All statewide events in which championships are determined are summarized and listed in the order in which they occurred.

A complete file of yearbooks published gives a complete summary of the activities of the Association since it was organized in December 1905. This does not mean that a yearbook has been published each year since 1905. The first one was published in 1927 and contained a summary of events from the beginning of the organization through the school year 1926-27. Additional yearbooks were published in 1934, 1940, 1942, and 1946. Each covered the activities of more than one year. Since 1946 the yearbook has been an annual publication.

24th ANNUAL COACHING SCHOOL

Rapid City, August 11, 12, 13, 1975

The twenty-fourth Annual Coaching School surpassed all previous schools in number of registrants. Coaches associations from the states of South Dakota and Colorado entered into an exchange program of clinicians which proved very satisfactory. All sessions were well attended, very informative and of great benefit to the coaches of the various sports. Colorado coaches conducting programs were: Gary Goings, basketball; Ed Kintz, football; Shirley Snyder, girls' gymnastics; Ken Larson, wresting and John Hoskins, track. In addition, Pat Halverson, North Dakota State University, instructed in girls' basketball; Lois Hoffman, South Dakota School Food Services, conducted sessions on nutrition and physical fitness; and A. G. Edwards, South Dakota State University, presented programs on athletic training and care of injuries. We owe our special thanks to the South Dakota Chapter of the American College of Surgeons, especially Dr. A. J. Janusz and Dr. H. L. Saylor for again arranging the training portion of our program.

WHAT IS THE ACTIVITIES ASSOCIATION?

Purpose

The purpose of the South Dakota High School Activities Association is to direct and coordinate interscholastic activities carried on by the member high schools of South Dakota.

It shall have the duty and obligation to control, coordinate, and direct the operation of the interscholastic activity programs of its member schools. Among these programs shall be those in athletics, speech, music, student council, publications, and such like or related programs of activities as now or hereafter may be organized among member schools.

It shall also attempt to equalize activity opportunity by standardizing qualifications for participants, coaching and directing procedures, and treatment of visiting teams and participants in connection with activities.

SDHSAA Contribution to Athletics

In the good old days, anybody could play on the high school team, even the coach, principal, or a college athlete on vacation. Age, school status, reason for being in the district, and related factors were nobody's business. When game brawls and community feuds made conditions bad enough, school administrators awoke to the need for organized action. Since that time, not only in South Dakota but throughout the nation, state athletic and activities association have proved their worth. Every student in every high school in the state is now assured that he competes under standards that are the same as those that exist in every other high school that voluntarily agrees to be a member of SDHSAA.

The SDHSAA has not been developed or dominated by any outside individual or group. Rather it has been created and is being expanded by school people because earlier unfavorable experiences have proved it necessary for the welfare of the school program. The amateur spirit cannot survive pressures which develop when controls are not provided.

History

The SDHSAA was organized in 1905 for the purpose of managing and fostering high school athletics on a high plane. At that time a Board of Control of three members was chosen to administer the affairs of the Association. They were G. E. Miller, Superintendent of Hurley High School; R. L. Kirk, Superintendent, Aberdeen High School; and A. A. McDonald, Superintendent, Sioux Falls High School.

Initial concerns were primarily in track and field. During the ensuing years it became evident that the SDHSAA should assume the initiative for a well balanced athletic program to meet the needs of all schools and all students desiring to participate in athletics.

In 1922 the Association became a member of the National Federation of State High School Athletic Associations which now includes all state associations and several Canadian provinces.

Down through the years each non-athletic school activity formed its own organization. In 1961, largely through the efforts of the South Dakota High School Principals' Association, the member schools voted to become an Activities Association. This step merged all of these organizations into one association which is the present South Dakota High School Activities Association.

Organization

All memberships are voluntary. Any high school in the state, whether public, private, parochial, or institutional, if accredited by the South Dakota Division of Elementary and Secondary Education, may become a member of the Association by making formal application that is authorized by its Board of Education and by subscribing to the rules and bylaws of the Association. Membership once attained is continuous, provided requirements are met and annual dues paid.

The legislative body of the Association consists of the entire membership, which meets once each year. Each member school has one vote whether the voting is done at the annual meeting or by mail ballot.

The executive body is the Board of Control which is made up of seven members, six of whom are high school principals or superintendents. The seventh member is a school board member elected by the Associated School Boards of South Dakota. The Board of Control meets at least four times each year and is charged with interpreting the Constitution and By-Laws, organizing and directing tournaments and meets, determining penalties and forfeitures for violations of rules, settling disputes, registering sports officials, establishing the state office, and employing an executive secretary and staff to administer the Association.







FOUNDER'S AWARD

Lorraine Norman, one of South Dakota's most respected publications advisers is the 1975 recipient of the Founder's Award, an award presented annually to an outstanding publication supervisor. Miss Norman, a Washington High School journalism instructor, received the award at the Supervisors of School Publications luncheon October 4 in Brookings. It was presented by Ralph Wilkinson, Assistant Executive Secretary of the South Dakota High School Activities Association. Most of Miss Norman's teaching career has been at Washington High, although she started in journalism as an adviser of the Beresford, South Dakota school paper. During her supervision of more than twenty-five years at Washington, the weekly high school newspaper, Orange & Black, consistently rated All-State, and several times won the Sweepstakes Award, along with the Washington High School yearbook. Miss Norman has been a member of the South Dakota Journalism Advisory Board, serving as Chairman, and has completed her second term as president of SDHSPA. She received her B.A. degree from Augustana and her graduate degree

Dr. Don Moses was the guest conductor for the Chorus. He is chairman of the Choral Department at the University of Iowa at Iowa City. Since 1965 Dr. Moses has been guest lecturer and clinician at some forty-five colleges or universities in some 18 states. Also during this period he has been guest conductor at all-state, regional, district or city festivals in 20 states.

Guest conductor for the Orchestra was Harry Lantz. He is professor of music at the School of Music, Peabody College, where his duties include conducting the University Center Orchestra and the Nashville Youth Symphony. Professor Lantz has served as guest conductor of all-state orchestra and university summer workshops in more than thirty-five states.

Competition on the local level determines which students will attend the Chorus. Each school may send one or more quartets based on the enrollment of the school. The Orchestra members were selected by auditions which included performance and a written test.

The South Dakota Music Educators' Association cooperated with the SDHSAA in planning and operating this All-State event.

ALL-STATE BAND

The All-State Band for this year was held at the Stevens High School Gymnasium in Rapid City on March 25-26-27, 1976. Members of the All-State Band assembled on Thursday evening to begin two and one-half days of busy rehearsal for the Grand Concert on Saturday evening.

Guest conductor for the 26th All-State Band is Mr. John P. Paynter, Director of Bands, Northwestern University, Evanston, Illinois. He is also director of the nationally acclaimed North Shore Concert Band of Wilmette (Illinois) and is an active composer and arranger with some 400 works to his credit. He is in constant demand as an adjudicator, clinician and guest conductor, and has appeared in these capacities in 47 of the 50 states, in Canada and Europe.

Schools represented in this year's band are: Rapid City Stevens with eighteen students; followed by Huron and Webster with ten each; Beresford, Watertown and Yankton with seven each; Aberdeen Central with six; Gregory with five; Arlington, Groton, Rapid City Central, and Redfield with four each. There were eight schools with three students in the band—Bridgewater, Brookings, Canton, Freeman, Madison, Milbank, Sioux Falls Lincoln, and Vermillion; twelve schools had two students in the band, and they are Aberdeen Roncalli, Faulkton, Highmore, Hurley, Lake Preston, Lead, Miller, Pierre, Sioux Falls Washington, Wessington Springs, White-Deubrook, and Winner. The remaining schools all had one student apiece in the band. They are Armour, Baltic, Bristol, Carthage, Centerville, Chester, Clark, Corsica, Cresbard, Dell Rapids, Faith, Flandreau, Gettysburg, Hayti, Hoven, Java, Kimball, Langford, Leola, Marion, Mellette, Mitchell, Mobridge, Montrose, Onida, Parker, Philip, Presho, Scotland, Selby, Sioux Falls O'Gorman, Spearfish, Springfield, Sturgis, Warner, and Waubay.

In the 1976 All-State Band there are 88 seniors, 55 juniors, 22 sophomores, and 5 freshmen.

The All-State Band had one student who had been a member of All-State Band for four years. Stephen Porter, Highmore, received the four-year gold medal.

REGION MUSIC CONTESTS

The member schools of the SDHSAA are divided into eight regions for conducting music contests. Actually, these contests are in the nature of a festival, as each individual or group is striving for a rating with no restrictions placed upon the judges as to the number of superior ratings which may be awarded in each category. There is no advancement to a state contest.

All eight regions held contests in 1975-76. In seven of the regions, solo and ensemble contests were held in February. In Region III, V and VII there were no large group contests. Region IV held both the solo and ensemble contest and large group contest on the same weekend in April.

1976 D. C. REUTTER MEMORIAL AWARDS 1976

The Reutter Award was initiated by the Reutter family in cooperation with the South Dakota Speech Communication Association. The awards were established in the memory of the late D. C.
