# FOREWORD

This yearbook is published annually after the close of the current school year. Its purpose is to serve as an annual report of the Executive Secretary and to provide a complete review of events sponsored during the year by the Association. All statewide events in which championships are determined are summarized and listed in the order in which they occurred.

A complete file of yearbooks published gives a complete summary of the activities of the Association since it was organized in December 1905. This does not mean that a yearbook has been published each year since 1905. The first one was published in 1927 and contained a summary of events from the beginning of the organization through the school year 1926-27. Additional yearbooks were published in 1934, 1940, 1942, and 1946. Each covered the activities of more than one year. Since 1946 the yearbook has been an annual publication.

# WHAT IS THE ACTIVITIES ASSOCIATION?

# Purpose

The purpose of the South Dakota High School Activities Association is to direct and coordinate interscholastic activities carried on by the member high schools of South Dakota.

It shall have the duty and obligation to control, coordinate, and direct the operation of the interscholastic activity programs of its member schools. Among these programs shall be those in athletics, speech, music, student council, publications, and such like or related programs of activities as now or hereafter may be organized among member schools.

It shall also attempt to equalize activity opportunity by standardizing qualifications for participants, coaching and directing procedures, and treatment of visiting teams and participants in connection with activities.

# SDHSAA Contribution to Athletics

In the good old days, anybody could play on the high school team, even the coach, principal, or a college athlete on vacation. Age, school status, reason for being in the district, and related factors were nobody's business. When game brawls and community fueds made conditions bad enough, school administrators awoke to the need for organized action. Since that time, not only in South Dakota but throughout the nation, state athletic and activities associations have proved their worth. Every student in every high school in the state is now assured that he competes under standards that are the same as those that exist in every other high school that voluntarily agrees to be a member of SDHSAA.

The SDHSAA has not been developed or dominated by any outside individual or group. Rather it has been created and is being expanded by school people because earlier unfavorable experiences have proved it necessary for the welfare of the school program. The amateur spirit cannot survive pressures which develop when controls are not provided.

# History

The SDHSAA was organized in 1905 for the purpose of managing and fostering high school athletics on a high plane. At that time a Board of Control of three members was chosen to administer the affairs of the Association. They were G. E. Miller, Superintendent of Hurley High School; R. L. Kirk, Superintendent, Aberdeen High School; and A. A. McDonald, Superintendent, Sioux Falls High School.

Initial concerns were primarily in track and field. During the ensuing years it became evident that the SDHSAA should assume the initiative for a well-balanced athletic program to meet the needs of all schools and all students desiring to participate in athletics.

In 1922 the Association became a member of the National Federation of State High School Athletic Associations which now includes all state associations and several Canadian provinces.

Down through the years each non-athletic school activity formed its own organization. In 1961, largely through the efforts of the South Dakota High School Principals' Association, the member schools voted to become an Activities Association. This step merged all of these organizations into one association which is the present South Dakota High School Activities Association.

# Organization

All memberships are voluntary. Any high school in the state, whether public, private, parochial, or institutional, if accredited by the South Dakota Division of Elementary and Secondary Education, may become a member of the Association by making formal application that is authorized by its Board of Education and by subscribing to the rules and bylaws of the Association. Membership once attained is continuous, provided requirements are met and annual dues paid.

The legislative body of the Association consists of the entire membership, which meets once each year. Each member school has one vote whether the voting is done at the annual meeting or by mail ballot.

The executive body is the Board of Control which is made up of seven members, six of whom are high school principals or superintendents. The seventh member is a school board member elected by the Associated School Boards of South Dakota. The Board of Control meets at least four times each year and is charged with interpreting the Constitution and By-Laws, organizing and directing tournaments and meets, determining penalties and forfeitures for violations of rules, settling disputes, registering sports officials, establishing the state office, and employing an executive secretary and staff to administer the Association.

# DISTINGUISHED SERVICE AWARDS

The South Dakota High School Activities Association has established a distinguished Service Award to recognize South Dakotans who have given outstanding service to the youth of the state through various high school activities programs. Candidates for the award are nominated by the schools with the final selection being made by the Board of Control. These awards fall into three categories: Service Through the News Media, Service Through School Programs, and Service Through Community Support. Awards for 1977 are as follows:

Service Through the News Media: Larry Desautels, Aberdeen, Sports Editor of the Aberdeen American News for 38 years; and Jim Ashley, Sioux Falls, career of 47 years with the Argus Leader as Sports writer and editor.

Service Through School Programs: Wally Diehl, Sioux Falls, athletic director for the Sioux Falls School System; Dwight Miller, Watertown, teacher and school administrator in Watertown for 47 years; Ford Kiner, Castlewood, coach and school administrator in South Dakota for 37 years; H. J. "Bud" Tiemens, Elk Point, teacher, coach, and school administrator for 41 years; R. M. "Bus" Walseth, 33 years as SDHSAA executive secretary.

Service Through Community Support: Adolph Silverman, Dupree, contributor to school activities programs for half a century; Marvin Borman, Stickney, life-long supporter of community youth programs.

## FOUNDER'S AWARD

### MUSIC

## ALL-STATE CHORUS AND ORCHESTRA

The 1976 All-State Chorus and Orchestra was held at the Arena in Huron on Friday and Saturday, November 5 and 6, 1976. The statistics for the music event are as follows:

The Chorus director for the All-State Chorus was Rodney Eichenberger. He is professor of music and conductor of the USC Chamber Singers at the University of Southern California in Los Angeles. Mr. Eichenberger is a former conductor of the Seattle Chorale. He has also been a guest conductor and lecturer in Australia and New Zealand.

Guest conductor for the Orchestra was Richard Anshutz of Santa Barbara, California. He is no stranger to South Dakota as he played in the Sioux Falls Symphony and he received his Master's Degree from the University at Vermillion.

Competition on the local level determines which students will attend the Chorus. Each school may send one or more quartets based on the enrollment of the school. The Orchestra members were selected by auditions which included performance and a written test.

The South Dakota Music Educators' Association cooperated with the SDHSAA in planning and operating this All-State event.

### ALL-STATE BAND

The twenty-seventh All-State Band had 167 members when they assembled in Huron on March 24, 25, 26, 1977. This year some 1100 students registered at the audition centers to be auditioned for the Band. The final membership represented sixty-two schools. The band students spent the two and one-half days in rehearsal for the Grand Concert on Saturday evening, March 26.

Maj. Allen Crowell, director of the U.S. Army Band since 1964 was the guest conductor for the 27th All-State Band. He is a native of Mobile, Ala. Upon his graduation from Princeton's Choir College, he entered the Army as an enlisted member of the chorus. In 1962, he was designated enlisted assistant director, and in 1964 he received a direct commission and assumed his present duties.

Featured soloist with the All-State Band was Spec. Jeff Arwood, whose home town was Huron. He was featured, playing three short selections with this year's All-State Band.

Schools represented in the 1977 All-State Band are: Rapid City Stevens with twenty students; followed by Huron with eleven; Watertown and Webster with ten each; Aberdeen with seven and Arlington and Redfield with six students each. Mitchell and Canton have five each; Madison, Onida and Yankton each have four students in the Band. There are nine schools with three students in the Band—Brookings, Gregory, Hoven, Milbank, S. F. Lincoln, S. F. Washington, Vermillion, White and Winner. Seven schools have two students in the Band—Beresford, Freeman, Hurley, Lake Preston, Leola, Mellette and Wessington Springs. The 34 schools that have one student each in the Band are: Aberdeen Roncalli, Bridgewater, Bristol Britton, Carthage, Castlewood, Chamberlain, Clark, Clear Lake, Colome, Cresbard, Delmont, Doland, Faith, Faulkton, Flandreau, Gettysburg, Groton, Highmore, Lead, Miller, NWLA—Mobridge, Parkston, Philip, Pierre, Presho, Rapid City Central, Selby, Sioux Falls O'Gorman, Sturgis, South Shore, Warner, White Lake, and Wolsey.

Looking at the membership of the Band by classes, there are 87 seniors, 55 juniors, 20 sophomores, and 5 freshmen in the Band.

The All-State Band had three students who had been members of the Band for the past four years. They were Lori Anderson, Hurley; Candy Nielson, Arlington, and Linae Sanger, Redfield.

### REGION MUSIC CONTESTS

The member schools of the SDHSAA are divided into eight regions for conducting music contests. Actually, these contests are in the nature of a festival, as each individual or group is striving for a rating with no restrictions upon the judges as to the number of superior ratings which may be awarded in each category. There is no advancement to a state contest.

All eight regions held contests in 1976-77. In seven regions solo and ensemble contests were held in February. In Regions III, V and VII there were no large group contests. Region IV held both the solo and ensemble contest and large group contest on the same weekend in April.

### SPEECH PROGRAMS FOR 1976-77

### ORAL INTERPRETATION

The speech program with the largest number of students participating in it is the oral interpretation program. With the new section that was added, the number continues to grow. The new section of Duet Memorized Interpretation gives two students the opportunity to act out a cutting from a play. The schools are divided into two classes. The Class "B" schools have their contestants start at a district contest and the winners move into the division contest. Here the Class "A" schools have students enter the contest. The winners from the division level contests go to the State Festival. Statistics continue to show that the students from the class "B" schools hold their own with those from the class "A" schools in both the division and at the State Festival.

### DEBATE

Two two-man teams from the same school met in the championship round of both the Class "A" and Class "B" final round of debate. In Class "A", a team from Watertown of Pat Howey and Brad Johnson was the champion and in the Class "B" division, the two-man team of Lisa Parliament and Steve Mundahl from Clear Lake were the winners. This was the 15th State Debate Championship that Watertown High School has won since 1915. The Clear Lake win makes the second State Championship that school has won since the schools were divided into classes in 1953. The Watertown team is coached by Donus Roberts and the Clear Lake team is coached by Ken Pickering.

The runner-up trophy in Class "A" went to another Watertown team of Mark Schenecker and Tim Fie. In Class "B" the runner-up trophy went to the other Clear Lake team of Ron Moore and Clair Morud.

This is the first year that a debate round was held to determine the third place team in each class. Sloux Falls Lincoln placed third in Class "A" and a team from Flandreau High School was third in the Class "B" debate.

Forty-two schools competed in the Association's division elimination tournaments that lead to the State Tournament. This included 21 "A" schools and 21 "B" schools.
